Berlin, Nov. 18.---The war is approaching a decisive stage---and the decision will rest with the campaign in Transylvania and Rumania. Such is the expert military viewpoint here. As summed up today by a well informed military authority, the situation is:

When this shall come depends on the progress of the present fighting in the Rumanian passes. 


