A special committee appointed by the Commercial club went to the Salem Indian school yesterday and investigated general conditions, in order to be able to make a proper report to John H. Stevens, chairman of the house committee on Indian affairs. The committee found things very much as Superintendent Hall had represented. One of the needs is that of remodeling the dormitory as now half a dozen of the pupils sleep in the same ward. The power plant requires reconstruction, as well as parts of several of the buildings and the walks. The committee is of the opinion that since the government owns 452 acres of the best land in the valley and since more than 600 Indian students attend the school, that it should be properly equipped for doing its work and not to be left in its present inefficient state.

The announcement is made from Portland that flour will decline 20 cents a barrel next Monday. This will not affect the local price, as the groceries here did not take advantage of the last advance. In other words, the Salem stores have been selling for three or five cents a sack under the market quotations. However, the impression is general that the top notch has been reached.
