Stopped Their Advance.

Bucharest, Nov. 25.—Landing of enemy troops at Islaz, Rumania, after crossing the Danube, but stoppage of their advance from Zimnicia (Simnizita) northwards was reported in today's official statement.

Occupied Islands.

Sofia, Nov. 25.—"We occupied islands in the Danube," today's official war office statement asserted, detailing progress in the campaign against Rumania.

In Dobruja the statement said, attack by superior enemy forces near Giurgevo, Lompalanka and Vidin were repulsed.

Like repulse of enemy attacks in Macedonia was also reported.

Warships Shelled Town.

Berlin, via wireless to Sayville, L. I., Nov. 25.—One British patrol boat was sunk and Ramsgate was shelled by German warships the night of November 23, an official statement announced here today.

The statement said: "Part of the German sea forces on the morning of 24th advanced to the northern outlet of the mouth of the Thames. No hostile sea forces were encountered, aside from one patrol boat which was sunk by artillery.

"The fortified port of Ramsgate was shelled. Since then no hostile sea forces became visible and our vessels turned homeward and arrived safely at their home port."
