PROPHECY WRITTEN IN 1600 COMES TO NOTICE IN WARTIME

(Aberdeen Free Press, Nov. 5, 1914.) A part of an extraordinary Latin prophecy made by Brother Johannes in the year 1600 is quoted in a recent issue of the Figaro. In deciphering the allegory, it must be remembered that France is represented by a cock, England by a leopard, Russia by a white eagle, Germany by a black eagle, and Austria by the "other eagle," while the lamb stands for justice, mercy and truth.

"Towards the year 2000, the Antichrist will manifest himself. His army will surpass in numbers all that can be imagined. There will be Christians among the legions and there will be Mohammedans and savage soldiers among the defenders of the Lamb."

"For the first time the Lamb will be all red. There will not be a single spot in the Christian world that will not be red, and red will be the heavens, the earth, the waters and even the air, for blood will flow in the domains of the four elements at once."

"The Black Eagle will throw himself on the Cock, who will lose many feathers, but will strike back heroically with his spurs. He soon would be crushed were it not for the help of the Leopard and his claws."

"The Black Eagle will come from the country of Lethar, will surprise the Cock from another side, and will invade the country of the Cock up to the middle of it."

"The White Eagle, coming from the north, will surprise the Black Eagle spirit, and of the purging of humanity, the country of the Antichrist from one end to another."

"The Black Eagle will see himself forced to liberate the Cock in order to fight the White Eagle, and the Cock will pursue the Black Eagle into the country of the Antichrist to help the White Eagle."

"The battles fought up to then will be as nothing compared to those which will take place in the country of Lethar, for the seven angels will together pour in the fire of their censers on the impious earth which signifies that the Lamb will order the extermination of the race of Antichrist."

"When the Beast sees that he is lost, he will become furious, and for many months the beak of the White Eagle, the claws of the Leopard and the spurs of the Cock will furiously strike at him."

"They will cross over the bodies of the slain, and these, in places, will change the course of the waters. They will bury only the men of noble families, the leading commanders, and the princes, because to the carnage made by the armies will be joined the wholesale death of those who will die of hunger or of the pest."

"The Antichrist will ask many times for peace, but the seven angels who walk in front of the three animals defending the lamb have declared that victory will only be granted on the condition that the Antichrist be crushed like straw on the barn floor."

"The exorcists of the justice of the Lamb cannot stop fighting as long as the Antichrist possesses soldiers to fight against them."

"That which makes the decree of the Lamb so impeccable is that the Antichrist has pretended to be a follower of Christ, and to act in His name, and if he does not perish the fruit of the Redeemer would be lost, and the doors of Hades would prevail against the Savior."

"The fight which will take place where the Antichrist forges his army will not in any way be a human fight. (This may have reference to Essen, where the Krupp works are, and many authorities believe that the decisive battle may take place in Westphalia.)"

"The three animals defending the Lamb will exterminate the last army of the Antichrist, but they will be forced to erect on the battlefield a pyre as large as a city, for the bodies of the dead will change the aspect of the countryside, as there will be mounds of the slain."

"The Antichrist will lose his crown, and will die in solitude and madness. His empire will be divided into 22 states, but none of them will any longer possess fortresses, armies or vessels."

"Curiously enough, this number coincides with the number of German states."

"The White Eagle, by the order of St. Michael, will drive the Crescent from Europe, and will install himself at Constantinople."

"Then will begin an era of peace and prosperity for the earth, and there will be no more wars, each nation being governed according to its desires, and living according to the rules of justice."

"There will no longer be Lutherans or Schismatics. The Lamb will reign, and the supreme happiness of humanity will begin."

"Happy will be those who, escaping 'From the Manger to the Cross' Sunday"

Clergymen of all faiths who happened to be in Palestine when the taking of the pictures began, staged many of them until the finish and were of great assistance to the promoters by reason of their special knowledge. For the pictures representing "The Flight into Egypt" the company journeyed to the land of the Pharaohs and these early scenes were actually pictured under the shadows of the pyramids. The company had a letter from the white house to the governor of Jerusalem, asking that all assistance be given to them, and as showing the interest taken by the authorities in the Holy Land the studio was visited by the governor and his staff, the religious judge of Jerusalem, the American consul, all the principal residents of the city, as well as priests and clergy of every creed.

It throws its creeping folds around that great central dynamo, the human heart, and ere we are aware of its dangers, oftentimes smothers the heart and chokes out the life. Obesity is one of the chief enemies of our body. It steals upon us in the guise of a friend and thrusts the deadly dagger into the heart, ere we suspect the assassin's purpose."

State News In Brief

D. T. Lawton of Medford, deputy sealer of weights and measures for the district comprising nine counties south of Linn to the California line, has been in Salem several days receiving instructions in his duties. He was appointed recently by State Treasurer Kay.

Governor Withycombe is scheduled to speak at an educational rally this evening at Hubbard. The citizens of that town expect to hold a patriotic rally also. County School Superintendent Smith will also be one of the speakers.

That there has been practically no winter loss among the live stock on the eastern Oregon ranges is the statement of Dr. W. H. Lytle, state veterinarian, who has spent some time in that part of the state recently. On account of the thin condition of the cows he says there will be a small percentage of loss among the calves. Loss of range lambs may amount to ten or fifteen per cent, in his opinion.

A. J. Elliott, son of P. A. Elliott, state forester, recently passed an examination for second lieutenant in the officers reserve corps. He is a senior at the University of Oregon and a member of the coast artillery company at Eugene.

Hearing was held today by the state water board of the controversy of the water rights on Trout creek in southern Harney county. J. B. Rousseau, J. B. Balcombe and J. W. Biggs, residents of Burns, appeared before the board in connection with the controversy.

The water rights of the Rogue River (Causal company) also came up for hearing with R. P. Cowgill of Medford representing the company.

The state water board has ordered the state engineer to begin a survey of the water rights on Cherry creek, which is a tributary of the John Day river and runs through Wheeler and Jefferson counties.

The state highway department has stated that concrete will be required to place in first class condition all grades and drainage in preparation for base and pavement if state aid is to be secured. The gravel and macadam roads which do not have sufficient depth on which to lay a pavement will be built up and completed by the state when the road is hard surfaced. Plans showing the standards that will be required for roads that are to be hard surfaced will be prepared by the commission as soon as possible.
