VOLUNTEER SYSTEM MAY BE RECOMMENDED

Washington, April 16.—The vote of the committee against selective draft indicated that unless sentiment in the committee will recommend the volunteer system be given a tryout before conscription is resorted to raise an army of 500,000 for service in Europe.

Two important amendments to the general staff bill were introduced in the committee today. They will be acted on by the committee tomorrow.

Another amendment by Representative Anthony of Kansas, provides for raising the army by a volunteer system. However, a military census of military eligibles will be started at once.

The selective draft was defended today by Representative Borah, Missouri, as the "fairest, safest and most democratic" national defense system.
