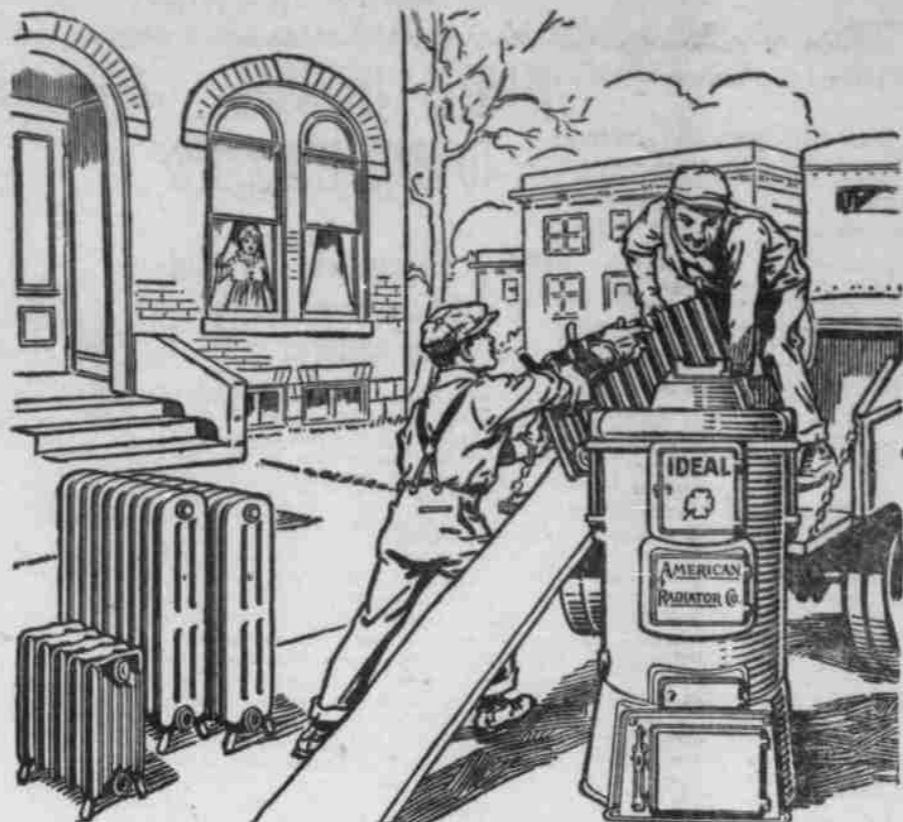

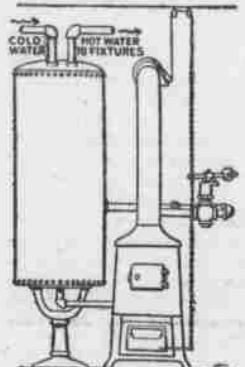

Today's stock market was of no great interest to anybody, reflecting, as it did, conflicting currents set in motion by the professional operators, who were more or less puzzled by what appeared at intervals to be good outside buying by substantial interests. The result was a wavering market of very tame aspect, with prices narrow and irregular at the opening, followed by a brief period of firmness, thereafter selling down a point or so in the case of the Standard Industrials and in the case of certain specialties like Bethlehem Steel B stock, United States Industrial Alcohol, Central Leather, 2 or 3 points or more. At mid-day there was a general stiffening which left prices not far from the level of the previous closing, but business became lighter, indicating that the supply of stocks was limited when it came to short covering or profit-taking.

The steel stocks were heavy throughout and at intervals distinctly weak, particularly United States and Bethlehem, because of the tax outlook for those companies as suggested in Judge Gary's statement.

The railroad list was quiet in the main, but there were moments of comparative animation under the leadership of Union Pacific and Reading, both of which advanced more than a point. Bonds were quiet and firm. Money rates were unchanged.

COMMITTEE AGAINST IT

Washington, April 16.—On a test vote the principle of the selective draft incorporated in the general staff army bill was beaten in the house military committee this afternoon by a nine to eight vote. One member present—Field of Kentucky—did not vote.

Alaska Pleased at Killing of Krause

Juneau, Alaska, April 17.—The body of Edward Krause, escaped murderer, who was shot and killed Sunday afternoon by Arvid Franzen, was brought into town yesterday afternoon and a sigh of relief spread over southwestern Alaska.

With a bullet in his body, Krause still had enough strength to make a desperate attack upon Franzen, though he finally was brought to the ground with a second shot. Franzen told the story of the capture of the murderer to a coroner's jury here, which exonerated him and recommended that the \$1,000 reward offered by Governor Strong for Krause, dead or alive, be paid to Franzen.

COUNCIL PERMITS LIGHTER STREET CAR

Three Remonstrances Against Abolishing Office of Police Matron

One of the important things coming before the Salem council last night was an ordinance introduced by Councilman Unruh allowing the Salem street railway system to make a change in the kind of cars that will be run over the streets. The change contemplated is from the double truck style of car to the single truck, which is considerably lighter. This type of car is known as the Ferney car and is in use in Seattle and Bellingham, Washington. The difference between the double trucks and the single trucks is a matter of much weight, as the latter are about 13,000 pounds and the former 40,000. There are six single truck cars now in use under special authority on the Salem lines.

The ordinance granting authority to make the change was introduced last night, and on explanation of Superintendent Billingsley that it was necessary to have immediate action on account of the difficulty in getting shipments from the east, the rules were suspended and the measure brought to a final vote and passed.

In the discussion concerning whether or not the ordinance should come to a vote at this time, Mayor Keyes was in favor of postponing and investigating the franchise provisions. Councilman Unruh insisted that the vote be taken and after some parliamentary tactics this was done.

About Police Matron

Three different remonstrances against the ordinance introduced by Councilman Unruh to abolish the office of police matron in the city of Salem were read. One of the remonstrances presented contained the names of about 400 Salem citizens who expressed themselves much in favor of retaining the office. The second remonstrance was presented on the part of the ministers of the city, and the third by the women of the W. C. T. U., who expressed themselves as being in favor of the office being maintained. It was shown also that the public in general is taking the matter up and that when the ordinance comes up it will be hard fought from start to finish.

The matter of the Twelfth street paving cases was brought up and City Attorney Macy gave notice that he intended to secure a rehearing of the case, which was decided against the city in favor of the property owners who objected to the assessments. The supreme court decided that the bids had not been advertised according to the provision of the charter and were therefore not legal. As a result of this decision, if it stands finally, the city will be compelled to repay the assessments already received from property holders on that street. It was intimated that the question would be brought up at the next city election in the form of an initiative measure to repay to all property holders in the city assessments made for street improvements. This would mean a repayment of about \$1,500,000.

To Have Street Signs

Bids were opened last night for street signs and the bid of Holborn-Freemantle of Portland, was accepted. The signs are to be furnished at sixty five cents each. The council decided to purchase 250 of these signs although the street committee recommended the purchase of wooden signs.

To be in line with other cities of the country in requiring that all business houses fly the American flag, Councilman Jones asked that the ordinance committee be instructed to draw up an ordinance providing for the flying of such flags. It was the opinion of Mayor Keyes and City Attorney Macy that such an ordinance would be unconstitutional. However, they suggested that a resolution might prove as effective. Councilman Jones agreed that if a resolution would be as effective he was willing to let it go at that. The motion passed with only three dissenting votes.

A special committee composed of Councilmen Wilson, Elliott and Unruh was appointed to investigate the purchase of a rock crusher for crushing rock required for street work.

Consent Bids A Tie

Four Salem firms submitted equal bids to furnish the city with cement and the city recorder was instructed to enter into a contract with each.

Instruction to go ahead with the construction of a pile bridge over Mill Creek on South Capitol street was given. The bridge is located between Mill and Oak streets.

A petition from the parent-teacher circle of the Lincoln school requested that the council take action in quarantining cases of whooping cough. The petition was referred to the ordinance committee.

The ordinance prohibiting the use of the national anthem, "The Star Spangled Banner," in melodies or parodies was passed by the council.

The ordinance requiring a license fee of \$10 a year from garbage collectors was passed. The money derived from the licenses goes to maintain a city dumping ground.
