SUBMARINE TOLL LIGHT Paris, May 18.—Only three French merchantmen were sunk by submarines in the week ended May 13, according to official announcement today. During that period 952 vessels entered French ports and 991 departed.

RED CROSS NOTES

The Red Cross movement is growing in the territory auxiliary to the Willamette Chapter. According to instructions from Washington, all chapters formed in Polk and Marion counties will be auxiliary to the Salem chapter and no auxiliary in the two counties can affiliate with any other chapter. Gervais was organized last evening Maclean will organize tonight, and Sunday speakers will be sent to Mouth and St. Paul to assist in forming organizations. A number of benefits are being planned for next week to raise money for the Red Cross. These will take the form of afternoon teas and parties in the evening. An old time rummage sale has been suggested and it is probable that this plan will be worked out as rummage sales generally add to the hilarity of nations besides leaving a lot of real money in the treasury for some good cause. In this case it will be the Red Cross. The books of Willamette chapter are open for inspection. The Red Cross is a public institution and if any one has any curiosity as to where the money is going, the books are open. One half of all money received goes to the general headquarters of the American National Red Cross at Washington City. According to the report of David W. Eyre, treasurer of the Willamette chapter, there is \$2,111.50 in the treasury. The receipts are as follows: Sunday items, \$20.50; general membership from those who have not affiliated with an auxiliary, \$1,130; subscriptions to Red Cross magazines, \$14; donations \$229.20; auxiliary membership, \$1,025. This gives a total receipts of \$2,427.70. The expenditures are as follows: Paid for sundry items, \$30; office expenses, \$84.52; raw materials for surgical supplies, \$189.59; paid for civilian relief, \$12; balance cash on hand, \$1,111.50.
