PLANS APPROVAL FOR MEMORIAL BUILDING

Caretaker To Be On Grounds and Building To Be Open at All Times

The plans for the Pioneer Memorial building to be erected at Champeog this fall were approved yesterday by the board of control.

The plans as drawn by George M. Post call for a building one and one half stories high, built of peeled logs ten inches in diameter.

A caretaker will be on the grounds and the memorial building will be open at all times to the public.

From the 40 foot front of the building two pergolas each nine by 80 feet will extend from each end towards the east.
