Electric Service Talk No. 6

"Groceries vs. Juice"

Frequently one reads financial reports of corporations in the newspapers, and the net income (or profit as some call it) seems very large to the average reader.

The value or desirability of an investment, however, is always rated by investors in terms of the per cent per annum on the investment that the net income, or profit, is equal to.

A great many more people are familiar with the average merchandise business more clearly than with the electric light business. We will, therefore, make a comparison between the grocery and electric light business that will probably throw a little light on the above matter of net incomes in the electric light business.

A large wholesale grocery firm testified before a tax commission that the amount of their gross sales per year equaled three times their investment at any one time.

The amount of an electric light company's gross sales per year only equal about ONE-EIGHTH of their investment at any one time.

This is due to the high cost of the electric light company's plant and equipment in proportion to its gross sales, as compared with the investment necessary in the grocery business to produce the same gross sales per year.

The following is an illustration of the result of these conditions:

	Grocery Co.	Electric Co.
INVESTMENT	\$100,000	\$2,400,000
Ratio of Sales per annum	3	1-8
SALES PER ANNUM	300,000	300,000
EXPENDITURES (Approximate)	294,000	156,000
Net Income or Profit	\$ 6,000	\$ 144,000
Net Income in percent of sales	2%	48%
Net Income in % per annum on investment	6%	6%

You will thus see that although the net income or profit is only 2% of the gross sales in the grocery business, and 48% in the electric business, that it is equal to 6% interest on the investment in both cases. Therefore, the net income or profit of 48% of the gross income is not excessive.

New Term for Men Accepted for Service

San Francisco, Nov. 13.—Men no longer are "exempted" from the draft. They either are "presently liable to military service," given "deferred classification," or "discharged," according to advance copies of the draft questionnaire received in San Francisco today. Men in the first class are subject to immediate call, those in the second, third and fourth classes have "deferred classification," and men in the fifth class are "discharged."

Reports that the questionnaire is to be a searching one were fully confirmed by the copy received. "What is your income? What was the profit of your farm last year? Is your business solvent?" and "How much capital is invested in it," are just samples of the questions asked.

Reduction In Price Will Save Potato Crop

Chicago, Nov. 13.—The Armour Grain company today declared that only the reduction of potatoes to fifty cents a bushel will prevent fully 100,000,000 bushels of the new crop from rotting or being fed to livestock.

"If consumers could buy them at fifty cents a bushel nearly all of the immense crop would be consumed, making a great saving in wheat and other foods, on which the government is economizing," declared a statement by the Armour concern.

"But consumers are paying around \$1.40 a bushel and are, therefore, using them very sparingly."

"The government estimated the potato crop on farms at 154,000,000 bushels more than last year and that, added to the big 'war garden' crop makes a very large amount over last year's supply."

"The food administration has announced the appointment of Samuel Livingston of Wisconsin as 'potato czar' for this section. He will inspect every car that is unloaded to determine whether any potatoes fit for consumption are left in it."
