The quotations from Portland which establishes the turkey market for the valley indicate that the retail price will be close to 35 cents, and that dressed turkeys in Salem will be sold to the markets at from 25 to 28 cents, according to quality. There are always a lot of culls or seconds in turkeys which must be disposed of at a low price. Hence the average will probably be about 25 cents a pound for dressed. Live ones are not much in demand.

Practically all the big buyers from the coast were in the yards, and, while there was no material advance in prices, sales were promptly made and the market in general was very active.
