## WAR REGISTRATION ADVISORY BOARD MEETS

Practically Members of Local Bar Present at Morning Session

The legal advisory board appointed to have supervision of the work of assisting registrants for the draft in deciding their classification, and in making out their answers to the questionnaire, pursuant to call met at the court house this morning with practically all members of the Salem bar present. The work was discussed at some length and assignments made of the attorneys who will take part in the work. The following letter, a copy of which will be sent to each of those selected, explains the matter fully:

Dear Sir: Your assignment on the legal advisory board, in accordance with the understanding had at the convention of members this morning, has been arranged in accordance with the enclosed schedule which has been made up to and including January 3rd, 1918 at one o'clock.

It has been thought wise not to make the schedule any further ahead until we find out how the schedule and general scheme of handling the matter will work out.

It is planned to supplement this schedule by further assistance if it is found to be necessary, but without in any way disturbing the allotments scheduled.

The understanding of members is that each man is drafted for this time, and if circumstances arise precluding the service arranged for the member affected will be expected to make arrangements for a substitute out of the list of seven members of the advisory board, a list of which is enclosed herewith.

When the list is done a report will be made by the permanent board to the adjutant general's office, setting forth the results obtained and including a list of those serving and those who have not served.

As based on the schedule, service begins Monday, December 17th, and extends over a period of twenty seven days, including Sundays and holidays. The morning board is assigned to duty from nine a. m. to one p. m.; the afternoon board, from one p. m. until six p. m. The county court room in the courthouse has been set apart for our offices and will be arranged for the accommodation of the work.

If your oath has not been already forwarded to the adjutant general, please send the same immediately.

Today was the first real day of the corn show and this afternoon the Murphy building was well filled with farmers and corn growers of the valley who came in to see the handsome display and learn how the judging was going.

Besides the large display of white, yellow and red dent corn, there was a fine display of English walnuts and hazelnuts by Wm. S. Walton of Salem, an attractive array of bottled "Phaz" by the Pleasant Fruit Juice company, "Loja" and "Apple" by the Northwest Fruit Products company, while displays of packed prunes were made by the Salem Fruit Union and the H. S. Gile company. Displays of packed fruits also were made by a number of packing plants over the valley.

An interesting exhibit of various methods of arranging seed corn for drying was made by the Oregon State hospital. Another feature attracting attention was a seed germinator. Last but not least was the tempting display of corn products in the way of hominy, delicious looking corn-bread, etc.
