Condition of winter wheat on December 1 was 79.3, against 85.7 and 87.7 in 1916 and 1915, respectively, and a ten year average of 89.3.

Rye acreage planted this fall 48 6,-119,000, which 36.6 per cent more than last year. Condition of rye on December 1 was 84.1, against 88.8 and 91.5 in 1916 and 1915 respectively, and a ten year average of 92.2.
