and shipment of projectile steel forty five per cent.

Turning to the results of the order, Rainey hurried this at the critics: "Every ship ready to sail in our ports had been bunkered in less than one week after the order. Since then it has been possible to load and coal 480 ships carrying two million tons of food and war supplies. These supplies are necessary for soldiers families for relief will be distributed to our own armies and the armies of our allies."

Rainey insisted the problem now is not one of coal production, but of transportation, as plenty of coal can be mined, if it can only be transported. He urged the immediate building of more engines and coal cars and greater conservation.

In closing, Rainey declared: "I undertake to say that in the history of this country no man has been subject to more unreasonable and unjust criticism than Dr. Garfield. The task which confronts him is greater than was ever undertaken by any executive officer prior to our entry in the war."

The letter referred to the statement of export business among the packers and said "A great many little packers were disappointed in the size of their allotment."

At this meeting Durand suggested a nation-wide meatless week, but he was overruled by the packers. The letter said who told him that such a conservation move, "would be as bad as the embargo on fuel."

Durand directed the packers to avoid advancing prices on the cattle market, according to this letter.

Cossacks Will Oppose
San Francisco, Mar. 1.—Eighty thousand trained Siberian Cossacks will oppose any "infringement" on Siberia's sovereignty according to Colonel Nicolas Alexandrovich Lietovsky, of the Russian railway guards who passed through San Francisco today on route to Washington from Russia. He was discussing the proposals to send Japanese troops into Siberia.

"Siberia will not be occupied by the Japanese without a stubborn and bloody resistance on the part of the Siberian people and the more radical elements in Vladivostok threaten to burn the city and the immense quantities of munitions of war rather than have them captured," he said.

He declared the Siberians have their own government and refuse to recognize the Bolshevik regime.

It is vitally important, in the governor's opinion, that the acreage be increased this year instead of being diminished, and he is urging the state council of defense to take action to prevent a decrease. A list of all persons who are willing to work on the farms this year will probably be made out.
