All donated except material for pajamas. We are devising ways and means to be self-supporting. Will hold a silver tea, Saturday afternoon, which promises to be a success. Also will soon offer a home-made cook book, of all the best tried and tested recipes we can gather. Much credit is due surrounding country clubs—the Howell Bee Hive and Walulah clubs, for help in the work.
