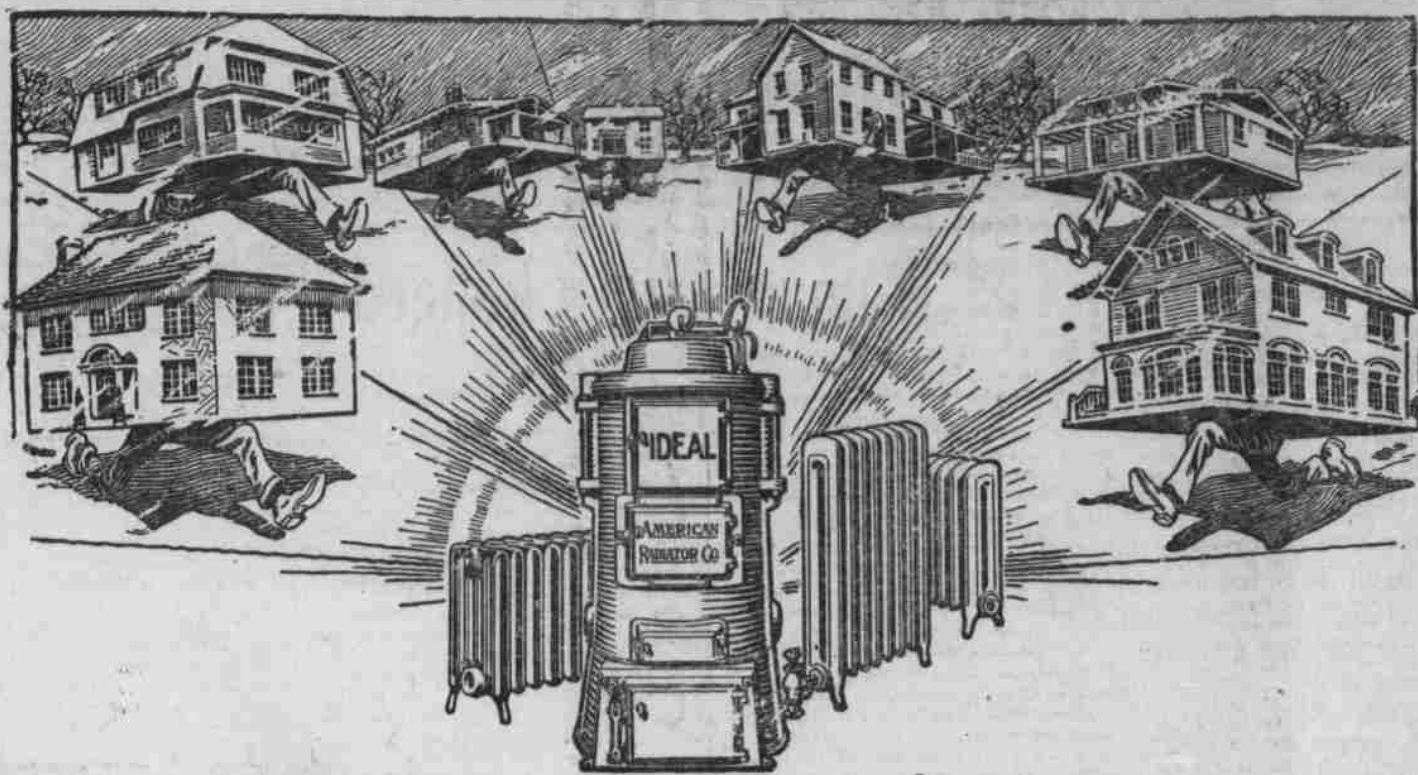

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GERMANS DESPERATE

ern bank of the Creve river, while Fokembay is three miles farther south-east and about two miles northwest of Concy. The day statement said the Germans had reached the line of Bihemcourt, Auterville and Barisis. These towns are on an east and west line through Pierremande, Barisis being six miles south of Lefere and three miles due north of Concy.

This is the first advance of any consequence by the enemy in this region since the offensive developed.

The German statement further reported the repulse of British and French attacks along the Aneer and Avre. On the east bank of the Meuse, in the Verdun sector, a successful German raid was reported. The London war office announced the re-establishment of former positions in Aveluy wood north of Albert and the breaking up of enemy attacks opposite Albert and south of Hebuterne.

A German attack in the region of Hangard west of Demuid, was broken up by artillery fire, the French communiqué said.

British Make Small Gains.
London, April 8.—British troops "advanced their line slightly" last night

east of Vaire and south of Corbie, along the south bank of the Somme, Field Marshal Haig reported today.

Corbie is on the north bank of the Somme, a mile east of the confluence of the Somme and Aneer and eight miles due east of Amiens. Vaire is a mile east of Corbie, on the south bank of the Somme. Staff correspondents reported heavy forces of Germans advancing from Vaire wood and fighting just outside Corbie at dawn Saturday. Haig's report would indicate the Germans have been pushed back at least a mile at this point.

"North of the Somme in the neighborhood of Neuville-Vitasse (three miles southeast of Arras), a few prisoners and a machine gun were captured," Haig said.

"On the whole British battle front the enemy artillery showed increased activity last night."

"Between Lens and the Labasse canal and east of Arras there was heavy hostile gas shelling."

Improves Each Day.

Washington, April 8.—"Each day that passes now finds the allies in a better position to resist with definite success. Each day reserves, which are already considerable, are being swollen by fresh contingents from our armies and that of the United States."

This was the summary of the west front situation today by Major General J. D. McLaughlin, British military attaché.

"Doubtless the Germans will make further great efforts before they acknowledge the failure of their 'great spring drive' but it is safe to say that each day that passes finds the allies in a better position."

A strong effort by the enemy to drive down the Somme to Amiens during which he used about 25 divisions on a front of a few miles, was stopped last week with complete success.

"Only in one place was the German line advanced, and then only to a depth of less than a mile on a narrow front," he pointed out.

"North of Albert the British advanced, beat off repeated and vicious attacks without bending. Near Montdidier the French withdrew a short distance to strong positions. The enemy is nowhere within nine miles of Amiens and is still three miles distant from the main Amiens-Paris railway, the cutting of which would be to bring him

no real victory. The best proof of his discomfiture is the use that he is making of minor incidents for 'window dressing' purposes.

Gains Valueless.

"A short time ago in the course of the steady advance of the British army in Palestine a small force was thrown upon the Jordan to cut the Hedjaz railway. Its work done, it retired from the waterless waste through which the rail-

way ran and rejoined the army.

"This retirement was advertised by the Germans as a triumph for the Turks who were alleged to have thrown the British force back over the Jordan. Similarly the Germans are gloating today over the capture of Pierremande and Fokembay in the neighborhood of Channy and in the forest of Concy. As a matter of fact these 'successes' are valueless, such advance as they imply is at the extreme south of the battle zone some 45 or 50 miles from Amiens. Its tactical value is no greater than its strategic value. Pierremande and Fokembay are only outposts of the real French positions in that neighborhood and there is no reason to believe that they were more than lightly held.

WOULD DIVIDE EUROPE

Washington, April 8.—Slicing up Austria-Hungary to free oppressed peoples within her borders will be demanded by a congress of Austrian nationalists meeting in Rome today. Represented in the session will be Rumanian, Polish, Czech, Slavov and Jugoslav and Italian delegates who now come under Austrian domination. The conference is not a war aim or a peace session, said a Rome cable today, but it will make plain to all the world that these peoples of the Austrian empire are bound by common interests and aspirations and that they intend to shake off the German, Austrian and Magyar yoke. The delegates take the position that division of the empire is the only way whereby these subject races can be free.

WANT FORTY-FOUR FROM MARION COUNTY

That Will Be Our Portion of 923 Called From State of Oregon

Portland, Or., April 8.—Nine hundred and twenty three more Oregon men are to be called to the colors immediately for the national army.

They will be inducted into the military service from class one, in the sequence of their order numbers. Orders have been received from the war department by the adjutant general of Oregon that all these men must be inducted for Camp Lewis, Wash., in the five day period beginning April 25.

This quota of 923 men is in addition to the draft quota of 369 men who were called into service from Oregon on March 29.

The 823 men comprises 12.5 per cent of Oregon's gross quota in the first draft.

No county in the state will be exempted from furnishing its proportionate quota of men to meet this call.

At the same time it is announced by the war department that each county will receive full credit on the next draft quota for the men sent now.

Though men from class one are to be inducted into service in the sequence of their order numbers, the calling of men actively, completely and as a duty engaged in the planting and cultivation of farm crops, by direction of the president, will be deferred until the end of the new quota.

Following is the official allocation, prepared by Captain John E. Collison, O. R. C. officer in charge of the execution of the selective service law in Oregon, showing the number of men each county must furnish by April 26 to fill the call for 923 men:
