COLONEL GRIFFITHS BURIED

With the American Armies in Picardy, May 5.—Lieutenant Colonel Griffiths who was killed by a shell as he was emerging from his dugout, rests in a grave such as he might have picked out himself—within sight of the enemy's lines.
The usual funeral ceremonies were impossible, because of the Germans' proximity and the constant bombardment of the American positions.
Without even a flag wrapped around the body, it was placed in a long trench and buried beside eleven other American soldiers.
The burial party was few in numbers, so a not to draw the boche fire. The chaplain and the others wore tin hats and gas masks.
No American valley was fired across the grave as the body was laid to rest, but the enemy shells overhead hummed a requiem.

Field and Levi Leiter and was one of the founders of the great Marshall Field store here. When he died in 1902 his fortune was estimated at \$8,000,000 and

its value is believed to have increased tremendously under the administration of Mrs. Palmer and her sons.

Throughout her career, Mrs. Palmer was vitally interested in charitable and political activities. She organized the Chicago Business Women's Club and was one of the founders of the Chicago Civic Federation which effected many civic reforms.

She was sent to Europe in 1900 as a member of the Paris exposition board, the appointment coming from President McKinley. She had served in 1893 as president of the board of women's managers of the Columbian exposition here. At that time she toured Europe, interacting foreign countries in sending exhibits.

For a time her interest in civic affairs and politics found outlet in the political career of her son, Honore. She personally directed his first campaign for election to the Chicago city council, which was successful. Near the close of the campaign she held a reception for several hundred members of a marching club in her million dollar Lake Shore Drive home and shook hands with hundreds of ward politicians and lodging house habitués who attended.

For years she was Chicago's supreme social dictator. An invitation to her annual New Year hall was regarded as a patent of social nobility here.
