


### Big Boxing Event

## Gas Rate Talk No. 4

As an example of the increased costs of operation, the cost of coal has advanced from \$5.44 per ton to \$7.32 per ton, an advance of 35%, with great probability of still further increases. As we used 2,400 tons of coal last year and will probably use at least 2,500 tons this year, it is apparent that the increase in the cost of coal will cause a large increase in the cost of making

Then, too, stokers wages have advanced from \$72.00 per month to \$100.00 per month, an increase of 29%. Most other labor costs have advanced accordingly.

The result of these increased costs will be to cause the gas plant to experience a loss of about \$1,461.00 this year, as shown in Gas Rate Talk No. 2, unless additional revenue is provided to the company by an increase in its rates for gas.

The above loss is the amount that the gross income will be exceeded by the total operating and fixed or overhead expenses. Therefore, the company would not only fail to receive any interest on the investment of \$215,-576.78 which the Public Service Commission has determined as being the actual value of the plant, but would also be out the sum of \$1,461.00 above mentioned.
