## BUYERS ARE URGED TO GET BUSY NOW

Upward Trend in Price, Downward Production Are Main Reasons for Buying Now

It is a good time to step in and buy that automobile that you are considering right now. Prices are on the upward trend and production trends downward, with shipments problematical. The war has first call on the country. The automobile industry itself has given more than any other to help win the war.

The cut in production of motor cars is the result of decreased facilities for automobile output due to the war contracts issued by the government, says Lee L. Gilbert, Elgin "6" distributor for Marion, Polk, Yamhill, Washington and Tillamook counties.

It is significant that even in 1917 production exceeded that of 1916 by approximately 20 per cent, and it is still more significant that right now used cars of all classes and makes are selling briskly at prices representing an advance over what the same cars were selling for a year ago. It is doubtful if there ever was a time in the history of the automobile business when there was as lively a market for used cars as at the present time, and when we consider this statement in the light of the admitted fact that the supply of automobiles has never equalled the demand, it is apparent not only that neither the buying power nor the buying indication of the public has diminished, but that it has actually increased.

I don't believe the productions will get back to where it was until after the war ends, the market is now oversold, the freight rates will advance 25 per cent, and all manufacturers are compelled to put into effect another advance. The great middle-class, including farmers and skilled workmen who make up the bulk of the buyers of medium priced automobiles are flush with money. Its natural that they should be spending part of it for convenience which they have never before been able to afford and that's exactly what they are doing. Can you blame them for not wanting to enjoy some of this life.

I am extremely optimistic over the outlook for the automobile business—not only for the period of the war, but for the immediate present. The prosperity of this industry for the present is limited not by natural economic causes which are fundamental, but by the desirability and necessity for our sacrificing selfish ends to the greater cause in which we are all so vitally interested.

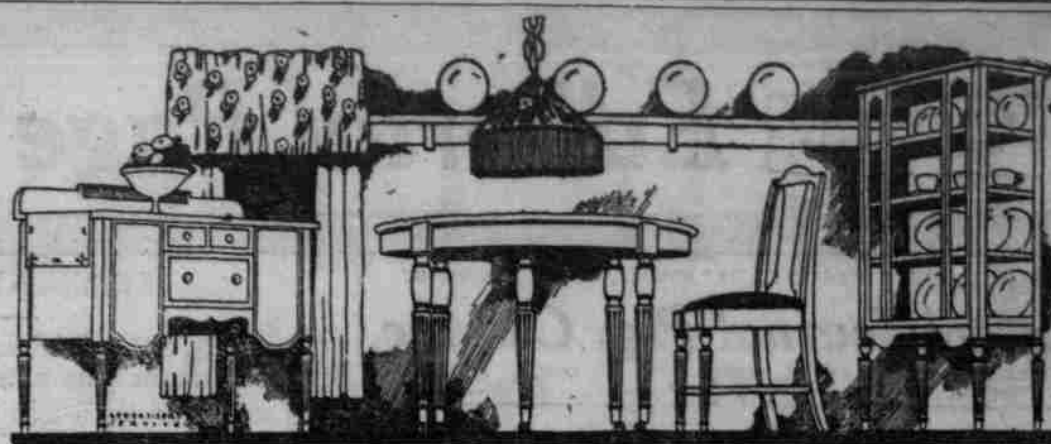
