



But this is not correct. Far from using 25 to 50 per cent, the andy industry uses something less than

per cent of the sugar used in this untry.

Even if the entire amount were cut ff from candy making, the sugar sittion would not be greatly relieved. The candy makers contend that all could share alike in the saving of sugar They have already given until it hurts. There is no more patriotic body of men than the men in the candy business and they have gladly given up their sup-plies but they now feel that the inter-ests of the country call for a definite knowledge of the facts. People must realize that the candy industry alone can not save enough sugar to solve the problem. Many people, without knowing the facts, have felt that candy could be curtailed and the problem solved. But


