Tied Up By The Printers Strike!

To the Public: Late last evening the Salem Typographical union without previous notice, ordered a walk-out of all the printers working on the paper. No notice was served on the publisher before action was taken or since.

The only alleged reason for the action taken by the union were editorials printed in the Capital Journal in which union leader activities in hindering war work were condemned.

The walk-out was not authorized by the International Typographical Union, which usually does not authorize strikes until all means of preventing them have failed.

It is simply a local attempt to gag the Capital Journal and prevent free expression of opinion.

The paper may or may not be issued in abbreviated form today—but we expect to overcome the difficulty soon and the paper will not be gagged.

We trust that our friends will appreciate our position and realize the injustice of the course taken by our enemies.
