AMERICANS IN POSSESSION OF ALL THEIR GROUND

German Offensive Made No Gain on Sector Held by Yankees

GENERAL PERSHING MAKES OFFICIAL REPORT

Detail of Operations Is Given By Commander In Chief Today

Paris, July 18.—The Germans sustained fully 70,000 casualties in the two days fighting in the "Dormans pocket" south of the Marne, the Marne declared today.

London, July 18.—American wounded arriving today from the scene of heavy fighting on the French front drew cheers from crowds at the Charing Cross station. Sympathetic girls flung flowers at the men as they were taken from trains and loaded in ambulances. Hands were waved as the American soldiers were taken away.

Washington, July 18.—American troops have gained entire possession of their sector on the south bank of the Marne, General Pershing reported today under date of July 17.

German thrusts against the American positions northwest of Chateau-Thierry were "completely broken up," Pershing's communique follows: "In the Marne sector our troops have entirely gained possession of the south bank of the river. Northwest of Chateau-Thierry the enemy yesterday repeated his attempt of the preceding day to penetrate our lines near Vaux. His attack was completely broken up by our artillery fire before reaching our lines."

"Yesterday in the region of Thincourt a hostile airplane was shot down by one of our aviators."

"Northwest of Chateau-Thierry, during the evening of July 14 and the evening of July 16, the enemy made determined but entirely unsuccessful attacks on our positions near Vaux," section B. "During the night July 14 to 15, he delivered a heavy bombardment, which included the use of much gas and which in the early morning developed into a barrage on the Vaux area. Under cover of this, a storming party attacked the village. The system of infiltration by groups was used and some of these groups passed one of our advanced outposts, northeast of Vaux."

Our troops delivered withering machine gun fire on the assailants and counter attacked on the right of the assaulting party, where the penetration had taken place. At the same time our artillery dropped a barrage in this section to cut off the enemy's retreat. The enemy fled but many were caught by our barrage and 18 taken prisoners. The attack was a complete failure, the enemy at no time penetrating our lines."

"On the evening of July 15 the attacks in this region were renewed. A box barrage, which again included many gas shells, was placed by the enemy on the Vaux region at 9:30 o'clock in the evening and several large hostile groups attempted to advance, firing heavily on our positions. This attempt also collapsed. Our infantry fire and a creeping barrage from our own outposts again broke up the assault."

EFFORTS BECOME WEAKER

Kean (United Press staff correspondent) London, July 18.—(5:15 a. m.)—First dawnlight efforts of the Germans originally spread over a front of more than fifty miles, are now concentrated on the twenty mile front between Vrigny and Combligny, in an attempt to advance toward Epernay and reach the Rheims salient.

(Vrigny is four miles southwest of Rheims, Combligny is eleven miles west of Epernay, and four miles south of the Marne.)

It is a lagging advance, petering out hourly, elsewhere, there are fluctuating local attacks, decreasing in power and intensity.

East of Rheims, the French and Americans have completely stopped the Germans. South of the Marne, from Chateau-Thierry eastward to the lines with the French, the Americans are holding like a stone wall.

So far, the Germans have failed to attain any of their objectives. They have engaged thirty divisions (360,000 men) and have nearly that number of reserves left, which it will be necessary to use.

WHOLE DIVISIONS OF YANKEE TROOPS ARE IN GREAT DRIVE

Secretary Baker Officially States That American Force Is Large

Washington, July 18.—Whole divisions of Americans are involved in the great counter offensive launched today by the Americans and French on the Marne-Aisne front, Secretary of War Baker revealed this afternoon.

Official reports from General Pershing, confirming United Press details of the drive declared the on-rush is still continuing.

(There are 27,500 men on an American division.)

The Americans fighting in the region of Soissons have been particularly successful, making a decided advance, the extent of which is not definitely known as this is cabled.

(This is the first invasion that American troops are engaged along the whole 25-mile front.)

Pershing Reports Success

Washington, July 18.—General Pershing, in dispatches to the war department this afternoon, announced progress of the Franco-American counter offensive on the Marne-Aisne front.

Commenting on Pershing's report, Secretary Baker said it was clear that many prisoners and much war material had been taken, Baker said.

"Official confirmation of the opening of the counter offensive along the line started in the morning has arrived from General Pershing."

American troops participated both as complete divisions and as units in association with the French.

"The first objectives seem everywhere to have been attained and, while no actual count has been made, it is clear that many prisoners have been taken and that guns and other war material have been captured."

"Our official reports also confirm the fact that the American soldiers advanced with the greatest dash and gallantry and were still advancing when last heard from."

French Counter-Attack

London, July 18.—French forces, attacking on a three mile front from the Marne northward, east of Chateau-Thierry, have recaptured Nanteuil, Ven teuil and the Bois De Roi, it was learned from an authoritative source this afternoon.

The French have been driven from the crest of the ridge south of Dormans by a German local operation.

The front about Chateau-Thierry has become stabilized.

They are just the barest possibility that instead of using these reserves, in an apparently fruitless effort to take Epernay the Germans will attempt another gamble and attack the British in the Somme and Aisne regions. But the British are on the alert and in the meantime the allied reserves are growing.

London morning newspapers are cautiously optimistic. The Express declares there is a possibility that "the failure will become a disaster to the Hun."

"It is dangerous to say it is a colossal defeat until we are more certain the German has shot his bolt," the Mail said.

GERMANS ATTACK AGAIN

Paris, July 18.—(10:35 a. m.)—The second phase of the new German drive in the Champagne region began today when the allies again passed from the aggressive to the defensive, according to the latest battle front dispatches.

The enemy is directing his heaviest blows toward the forest of the Mountain of Rheims, which he expects to penetrate through the middle and reach the main Rheims-Epernay highway, splitting the forest on a north and south line today.

Moderate estimates of the casualties inflicted by the Americans and French in the Marne fighting during the first two days placed them at sixty thousand.

RURAL DISTRICTS RAISE FULL QUOTAS

They Will Accordingly Be Exempt From Similar Campaigns This Year

Rural school districts that have raised their quotas during the war savings stamps campaign will be exempt from future campaigns this year, according to W. M. Smith, chairman in charge of the rural districts.

The quota for Marion county for this W. S. S. campaign was \$972,000 and of this amount, \$522,000 was pledged during the campaign and \$190,000 previously, making a total of \$712,000. There remains yet to be raised before the first of the year the sum of \$260,000.
