"Roll of Honor" "From Over There" General Pershing's Official Report

Washington, Aug. 8.—Three hundred and forty five casualties were announced by the war department today—237 from the army and 108 from the marines.

The army list was divided as follows:

Killed in action 131; died of wounds 16; died of airplane accident 1; died of accident and other causes 5; wounded severely 62; wounded, degree undetermined, 22.

Killed in action 2; died of wounds 1; wounded, degree undetermined, 1; wounded severely 20; wounded slightly 1; missing in action, 10.

Today's lists brought the total since the Franco-American drive started up to 3032.
