General Pershing's Official Report

Washington, Aug. 8.—Three hundred and forty five casualties were announced by the war department today—237 from the army and 108 from the marines.

The army list was divided as follows:

Killed in action 131; died of wounds 16; died of airplane accident 1; died of accident and other causes 5; wounded severely 42; wounded, degree undetermined, 22.

Killed in action 2; died of wounds 1; wounded, degree undetermined, 74; wounded severely 20; wounded slightly 1; missing in action, 10.

Today's lists brought the total since the Franco-American drive started up to 3032.

Members Of Board On Deferred Class

Sacramento, Cal., Aug. 8. — All exemption board members and government appeal agents within the new draft age who are certified by the governor as being necessary in the administration of the draft should be given deferred classification, according to a telegram received today by Governor Stephens from Provost Marshal General Crowder.

"This department thoroughly appreciates the magnitude and essential character of the work of draft officials and is keenly alive to the importance of retaining the services of members of boards and government appeal agents, and, to this end, of granting deferred classification on the ground of necessary employment in the service of the United States," Crowder declares in his telegram.
