EXCESS PROFITS TAX NOW YET SETTLED

Many Important Questions Yet Remain To Be Decided Upon

Washington, Aug. 10.--With only a week remaining before the new revenue bill is scheduled to be reported to the house the ways and means committee to day still had to settle on an excess profits rate, frame a war profit tax and gather the loose ends of luxury taxes. The committee has tentatively decided to adopt the recommendation of its subcommittee for a ten per cent retail sales tax on all things commonly recognized as luxuries.
