Endangers German Position
London, Aug. 19.—The attack between the Oise and the Aisne by the French which joined up the two main battle fronts, was started at six o'clock Sunday evening, it was learned today. The advance seriously threatens the German positions eastward along the Aisne, it is declared. Since Saturday the French have advanced their line three kilometers (a mile and three quarters) on this front. French pressure continues on the front west of Roye between St. Mar and Bourguignes, where a number of German prisoners were taken yesterday and also northeast of Canny-Sar-Matz.

Amsterdam, Aug. 19.—Archduke Joseph has replaced Field Marshal von Hoerndorff as commander of the Austrian mountain army group on the Italian front, according to a Budapest dis-

patch here today. Will Stand with Czech' Rome, Aug. 19.—Montenegrin troops will fight at the side of Czech units on the Italian front, it was announced today.

Continued from page one) ing rice to force a higher price and the government is greatly concerned over their actions. Steps to break up the rice trusts have already been taken. Among them is prohibition of exportation of rice. Measure against rice speculators may be taken and it is almost certain that the government will buy vast quantities to distribute to the people at cost. Officials deny the theory that pro-Chinese and bolshevik activities are responsible for the uprising and declare socialist thought is entirely absent in Japan. Through the strong national military police the government will be able to hold a strong hand over the masses and shortly put down disorder, officials say.

GOT 250 SUBMARINES
London, Aug. 19.—(British admiralty wireless.)—The naval correspondent of the Sunday Observer points out, that in addition to the 150 submarines which Premier Lloyd-George recently declared the British alone had sunk, that a good proportion of the "doubtful cases" may be regarded as destroyed and that the number may be safely raised to 200. Another fifty have probably been destroyed by French, Italian and Americans. To say that 250 submarines have been accounted for, may be regarded as a moderate estimate.

SANK OFF CAPE HENRY
Washington, Aug. 19.—Sinking of the Norwegian bark Nordhav, off Cape Henry, was reported by the navy department today. The crew of 26 was picked up by a naval vessel. The bark was shelled and torpedoed by a German submarine, members of the crew said, about 100 miles south of Cape Henry.
