But today, while recognizing the need of supplying heat for the system, it is known that alcohol is not the thing—that, on the contrary, sugar supplies the system with earbohy frates,

The various quartermasters' departments draw large supplies of candy for the soldiers to cut. Three requirements run into the hundreds of thousands of pounds

On a recent cruise, for example the Atlantic squadron, carrying NO LIQUOR aboard, had on its various slips 40,000 pounds of caudy because it recognized candy as a nutritious food for the sailors.

The anid test of war is putting cande down as a FOOD- a food which applies the body with fuel.

Many physicians and scientists claim that caudy will supplant the taste for sicoholic beverages. This is probably one reason why, as candy is becoming more and more firmly established and recognized, alcoholic drinks are declining. Right along with the decrease in whiskey prinking, one notes the tremendous increase in the recognition of exady as a food.

Men who once thought that whiskey would bolster them up, now find that in cardy they get a real source of bodily fuel and energy.

Many people used to wonder what would be the substitute for drinking to supply heat for the system. People have found that sugar is the real source of bedily fuel, supplying earbohydrates sugar is most enjoyed by many people when made up into a food product, mixed with fruit, nuts, etc.—all high in food value.

man female aliens A German alien woman changing her place of resultance to another place with in the same registration district shall immediately report such change to the registration officer of the registration listrict and present to such registration officer ber registration eard for the pur-pose of having endorsed thereon by such registration officer the change of rest-

A German female who desires to change her place of residence to a place of residence within another registration district must obtain a permit. Such German alien female must present her-self to the registration officer of the listrict in which she resides and make application for the permit on a form
