Regulation For Draft Under Man Power Law

United States Marshal G. F. Alexander received instructions from the Attorney General of the United States, calling attention of German alien females to the following important requirement, governing the change of residence of German female aliens.

A German alien woman changing her place of residence to another place within the same registration district shall immediately report such change to the registration officer of the registration district and present to such registration officer her registration card for the purpose of having endorsed thereon by such registration officer the change of residence.

A German female who desires to change her place of residence to a place of residence within another registration district must obtain a permit. Such German alien female must present herself to the registration officer of the district in which she resides and make application for the permit on a form
