572 Accidents and Four of Them Fatal Is Record For The Week

During the past week the state industrial accident commission has received reports of 572 accidents, of which four were fatal, as follows: John Ryder, Portland, shipbuilding; Wm. Bishop, near Spomooe, Logging; N. U. Nelson, Columbia City, Shipbuilding; Fred W. Bradshaw, Gresham, Logging.

Of the total number reported, 228 were subject to the provisions of the compensation act, 36 were from firms and corporations which have rejected the provisions of the compensation act, and 14 were from public utility corporations not subject to the provisions of the compensation act. Of this number five were travelers on the public highway, one being a passenger.

AMERICAN TROOPS NOW INDEPENDENT OF BRITISH AND FRENCH

Action In Making Them Separate Unit Sets Wise Ones To Guessing.

Washington, Aug. 31—Senators who consulted General March viewed a significant statement which they said were made to the effect that Americans had been gradually withdrawn from British and French brigading, until now practically all were operating independent of the allies.
