Oregon University Discontinues Athletics

The University of Oregon has dropped all athletics for the present. The unexpected action of that institution is commented upon as follows by James J. Richardson in the Oregonian:

"The University of Oregon has suspended intercollegiate athletics for the duration of the war. The foregoing startling and what some people might think radical statement was issued at Eugene last night by Dean Walker, graduate manager of student athletic activities at the State University. The news which will undoubtedly be a surprise to all interested in intercollegiate sports, broke when a reply was sent Hugo Beadek, ex-University of Oregon football, baseball and basketball coach, who was recently appointed director of physical education at Pennsylvania State College.

"This sudden and drastic change of plans came as a result of yesterday's visit to the Eugene institution of Chancellor Elliott, of the University of Montana, who has charge of all military colleges, coupled with the resignation of Hugo Beadek. Chancellor Elliott told the university faculty that these men wanted the men's full time and 12 months out of the year.

"This statement by Chancellor Elliott hit the university officials at a time when they were weak-kneed from the resignation of Beadek and undoubtedly had a large influence in bringing the lemon-yellow officials to their decision to discontinue athletics for the period of the war.

"The following telegram was sent to Beadek last night: 'Under new plan adopted here today university will give full time to developing military work. All intercollegiate athletics are suspended for the period of the war. We accept your resignation and cancellation of contract. Will have place for you after war. Good luck.'
