Carload Of Elgin Sixes Coming To Salem

Lee L. Gilbert, state distributor for the Elgin Six, announces that a carload of Elgin Sixes, 1919 models has been shipped to Salem and that the factory is in position to take care of its customers the coming season.

The military scout model is the latest, named after the car that broke all world records in its 6202 mile run from Chicago to the Pacific coast and back with sealed hood and chassis. It is a popular four door type, snappy and artistic in design and will easily seat

five people. The difference between the touring car and military scout model is in the body and tops.

The motor is the famous valve in head six cylinder on bloc, valves located in cylinder head, which are removable making adjustment very accessible. The crank shaft is drop forged and heat treated. The transmission is the Brown-Lipe with heavy nickel steel gears. The carburetor is a Stromberg especially built for the Elgin. The starting and lighting system is the well known Wagner with a Willard battery.

Mr. Hanson, Salem manager for Lee L. Gilbert, has given the new model a thorough test and is convinced of the superiority of the military scout model.
