It is Now Four To One In Buying Wheat Flour

For the benefit of those who are still somewhat in the dark regarding the latest rulings regarding the purchase of wheat flour, County food administrator Lockwood issues the following.

With a 50 pound sack of wheat flour, there must be purchased twelve and one half pounds of any one or any combination of the following: corn meal, corn flour, barley flour, rice flour, oat flour, potato flour or buckwheat flour. Other substitutes are kaffir, milo and fetteria flour. These are the seven flours that the average grocer keeps in stock that may be used as a substitute.

However, if one wants to buy pure rye flour, with a purchase of 30 pounds of wheat flour, the proportion is 33 pounds of the rye flour. There is no limit to the amount of flour one may purchase, just so the proportion is four to one, with the exception of rye flour which is three to two.

A distressing case of poverty and sickness was reported to the Salvation Army a few days ago and has been investigated by Captain Miller. A young woman, bedfast from tuberculosis, brought on by exposure and lack of food, and her almost blind mother, have struggled along without telling anyone of their need, until found by a kindly neighbor to be almost destitute. Almost everything is required for a sickroom but the greatest need is a single bed, complete with a good stiff spring, mattress and pillows. Bedding of all kinds and any comfort or delicacy would be very acceptable. Salem people have never been behind in kindness and Captain Miller is confident they will "come across" again. SALEM TO BE FIRST OVER IN FOURTH LOAN Campaign Will Start Thursday Of Next Week. Quick Work Planned

Instead of waiting for the official day, Sept. 28, to put on the drive for the Fourth Liberty Loan, the county executive committee decided last evening to jump into the campaign at once and have it over by state fair week.

It was felt that as long as the people of the county knew they would be called on for subscriptions greatly in excess of the last drive, that there was no special reason in delaying matters especially since it was made known that the national loan headquarters was willing that work should be done before the official date of Sept. 28.

Hence at a called meeting last evening of the executive committee and others who will have charge of the drive, it was decided to at once begin the active preliminary work in the way of selecting captains and workers.

At the opera house on the evening of Wednesday next week, Sept. 18, there will be held a meeting of instruction for the 400 or more workers when the general plans of the campaign will be gone over. To this meeting all especially interested in the work of the drive will be welcome.

The active drive will begin on the morning of Thursday, Sept. 19 and the town has been divided into districts and captains assigned to each. Captains have also been assigned to the rural districts and it is hoped that by quick and concerted action, the quota of Salem and Marion county will be raised in a few days and that the city and county will have the honor of being the first in the state to go over the top.

In charge of the campaign, which will doubtless be one of the most intensive ever put over in Salem and Marion county are the following: F. G. Deckerbach, county chairman; Frank J. Chapman, as manager of the Commercial club, city chairman; Dr. R. E. Lee Steiner, general in charge, assisted by W. H. Hamilton. The executive committee which will have charge of the details of the campaign include Jos. H. Albert, W. S. Walton, D. W. Eyre and S. B. Elliott.

Each captain will be assigned ten active workers who will agree to get out and work beginning with next Thursday. The captains in charge are: E. S. Tillinghast, Frank B. Southwick, J. A. Baker, Glenn Urrah, A. E. Hucklestein, Jr., W. W. Moore, T. K. Ford, N. C. Kafoury, Leo N. Childs, Jas. D. Hartwell, Curtis B. Cross, O. A. Hartman, W. G. Allen, Homer H. Smith, Arthur Lawrence, Frank Davey, William McGilchrist, Jr., O. B. Webb, Louis Lachmann, W. A. West, R. O. Bishop, O. B. Gingrich, L. A. Marshall, G. C. Bellinger, F. L. Waters, C. O. Rice, Elmer Dams, Paul Johnson, Jos. Baumgartner and John Beyne.

For the rural route districts, the following captains have been placed in charge: Route 3, B. J. Mills; route 4, L. J. Lowndes; route 5, Dr. A. Morfield; route 6, C. A. Elliott; route 7, W. C. Dyer; route 8, Seymour Jones; route 9, R. O. Snelling.

On the evening of Saturday, Sept. 21, there will be the Women's Service parade in which all women in the city and county are asked to take part in a parade in the evening in Salem, with patriotic addresses at Wilson park. Chas. V. Galloway, chairman of the speakers committee will secure a speaker from Portland for this occasion. In charge of this woman's parade, to include all women who have relatives in the service are Mrs. Lawrence T. Harris, Mrs. Chas. Weller, Mrs. W. M. Hamilton and with them Miss Mattie Beatty, county chairman of service parades.

It is felt that Salem and Marion county has the spirit to not only raise the quota, but to be able to put it over in so short a time that the city and county may be not only the first in the state to report, but if possible the first in the entire country.

SALEM TO BE FIRST OVER IN FOURTH LOAN Campaign Will Start Thursday Of Next Week. Quick Work Planned

All Prune Shipments Held Up For Present

San Francisco, Sept. 14.—All prune shipments were held up today on order of the United States food administration, to permit a survey of the damage done to the crop by the two day rain storms which swept northern California.

Officials of the California Packing corporation estimated that half the prune crop in Santa Clara county is ruined with a loss of nearly \$5,000,000.

The food administration order, issued after a conference between H. Clay Miller, head of the division of coordination of purchase and packers, was said to amount to commandeering of practically the entire prune crop.

Packers and shippers in Oregon and Washington also have been requested by the food administration to hold up further shipments until requirements of the government have been filled.
