Fate of Suffrage Bill In Hands of One Senator
Washington, Sept. 19.—The fate of the suffrage resolution in the senate appears to be in the hands of Senator Christie Bunt, South Carolina, who has never told on which side he will vote.
Suffrage leaders are counting on Bunt, because his wife and daughter are ardent suffragists.
If Bunt votes for suffrage, the resolution should pass the senate, by one vote. If he votes no, it may lose.
Senator Jones, New Mexico, chairman of the suffrage committee, said today he expects little debate when he calls the resolution up September 26, Senator Curtis, republican whip notified all absentees to be on hand for the 26th.
