

Frosts Damage Late Fall Crops. Bevere frosts of the past two nights have seriously damaged the late fall erops such as tomatoes and encumbers in this section of the county. A number of farmers had large acreages set out to tomatoes and in some instances crop had just began to ripen when the frost took the vines. The temato crop has book the vines. The temato erop has been unusually large this year and with the prospects of a late crop numbers of housewives had cut off cauning the product until later in the season. The grape crop has been hit hard by the freets in some cases while in others very little damage has been done.

Polk Prune Crop Nets Large Sum.

The Polk county prune crop for this

The Polk county prune crop for this year has been estimated by A. C. Petersen, manager of the California Pack-ing Corporation plant in Dallas as being close to 5,000.000 pounds, which when sold will bring to the growers some-thing like \$450,000 Most of the pranes are grown around Dallas and the wave of prosperity has already gegon to strike the town. To take care of the large increase in acreage coming into large increase in acreage coming into bearing this year the California Packing Corporation has enlarged their big packing plant with an additional 40 feet space, three stories high and have installed a number of pieces of new modern machinery which will enable them to take care of the crop in a much quicker manner than heretofore. Dried prunes have already begun to arrive at the plant and before the last of the week the forces will be working day and night to take care of the inday and night to take care of the in-coming product. The run this year will be about the same as last year, about nine months being set on the time to process and ship the 1918 crop.
