Commissions Allowed For Handling Eggs

Portland, Or., Oct. 8.—Now that fresh eggs are becoming so scarce and high, a good many cold storage eggs are being withdrawn from the coolers...

Thomas G. Farrell, assistant food administrator, has the following to say regarding the rules and regulations affecting cold storage eggs...

The original packer or storer, in selling cold storage eggs to wholesalers and suppliers of hotels, institutions and restaurants...

A jobber, if he sells cold storage eggs "at mark," or un-candled, may make a profit of 5 per cent.

A supplier of hotels, restaurants and institutions may exact a profit of not to exceed 12 per cent on the sale of candled goods.

The retailer may take a profit not to exceed 15 per cent over his cost.

In figuring "cost" the dealer, if he candled the eggs, may figure the net loss, but may not include the expense of labor and materials in so handling.

Profits on Butter

The food administration says that cold storage butter must be sold by the holder at a reasonable profit and at the same time sets certain figures as a maximum that may be taken as a profit.

Carlots, 1c. Less than cars but amounting to 7000 lbs. or more, 1 1/2c.

Less than 7000 lbs. but amounting to 3500 lbs. or more, 2c.

Less than 3500 lbs. but amounting to 700 lbs. or more, 2 1/2c.

Less than 700 lbs. but amounting to 100 lbs. or more, 3c.

Less than 100 lbs., 3 1/2c.

The rules seem very plain in the matter of profits and the margins are quite liberal and the food administration trusts that when an examiner visits those who are stowers of butter he will find nothing to which he can take exception.

Germany's Answer Same As To Bulgaria

London, Oct. 8.—The allies' reply to Germany's offer of an armistice should be the same as that to Bulgaria—"all right if you are willing to guarantee your sincerity by evacuation of France and Belgium, demobilization of your army and immediate surrender."

This is London's first reaction to the latest peace drive. The proposal is viewed with some suspicion as to be expected. Nobody wants to prolong the war a day longer than is necessary, but everybody is agreed that it would be a greater tragedy to allow the allies to be tricked out of the victory which is within their grasp.

The press generally regards the offer to accept President Wilson's fourteen points as a basis for negotiations as insufficient. The newspapers believe that it is necessary that Germany should accept these points unqualifiedly before beginning peace negotiations.

The papers declare their belief that Germany's proposal is the result of Marshal Foch's victories and they insist that peace shall not be a "bar gain" peace. Several strongly urged a "detracted" peace, cautioning against possible German paces.

McClary Sells Farm Near Willamina For \$20,000, With Crop

Willamina, Oct. 7.—H. L. McClary has sold his farm of 115 acres, located four miles north of this place, in the Willamina valley, to J. H. Robinson, consideration being \$20,000.

The sale includes a crop of prunes estimated at 1200 bushels, besides house hold goods and other personal property. The farm was originally improved by a native of Germany, who built the house at a cost of \$24,000, a \$4000 barn and made other improvements on an elaborate scale.

Mr. Robinson, the new owner, is local buyer for the Union Meat company. He plans to move onto the farm with his family at once. H. L. McClary will move to Portland, where he has property interests and later expects to go to South Africa to look after holdings in a diamond mine.

BRITISH STRIKE BLOW

while getting their materials safely behind the next line of defense. It is too early to judge the nature of the German resistance, as this capsule is filed. It is a subject of keenest speculation.

The British lined up in the cool, wet autumn night. The first attack was made at 2:30 a. m. There was some disposition to believe the Kaiser's guarded admission in his Sunday's order of the day, that he is compelled to beg peace as the result of the demoralization of the German troops, but the British report there is no evidence of any great change.

The 2:30 attack was delivered by part of Byng's army for the purpose of gaining the high ground at the northern end of the Bearevoir line at Masnières.

American troops, fighting in part of Rawlinson's army, advanced at 4:30 in the direction of Brancourt and Prement which are 400 yards from the starting point. Ten German divisions, including seven which are badly worn, met the attack.

The attack apparently is being made over a front of about 15 miles, extending from Sapanvillers southward to Fresnoy-Le-Grand. The Americans apparently are operating on a front of about three miles in the center.

Americans Gain Berlin, via London, Oct. 8.—Renewed American attempts to break through south of Chatel broke today. The German war office reported today. North of Chatel the Americans gained a temporary footing.
