

London, Oct. 25.—Continuing their drive against Maubeuge, the British Third and Fourth armies have made important progress on a front of nearly 35 miles, extending southwest of Valenciennes to northeast of Isgny.

They have reached the western edge of the Mormal forest along its whole extent, and are on the outskirts of LeQuesnoy, 15 miles directly west of Maubeuge. More than 7,000 prisoners and 100 guns have been captured since Wednesday morning, when the attack was launched over a front of about 17-miles.
