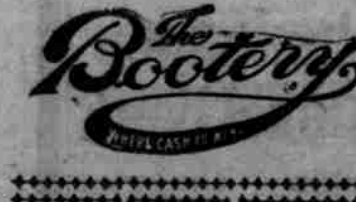

Prominent German Socialist Released

Amsterdam, Oct. 25.—Dr. Karl Liebknecht, former socialist member of the Reichstag, has been released from prison where he has been serving a sentence for attempting treason, it was announced today. Liebknecht was released on Tuesday and a popular demonstration marked his exit. Liebknecht was arrested in Berlin in connection with a May Day celebration, May 3, 1916. His sentence of thirty months, by a Berlin military court, caused great disorders among the socialists of Berlin, Stuttgart, Leipzig and other cities.

ing to deal with this condition of mental terror in Germany, it might well prove advisable to the military leaders to decide upon no winter respite for the foe. There are no impossible obstacles to successful winter fighting if pressed with vigor.

Today's new offensive by the British and Italian armies along the Piave is an effort to knock Austria-Hungary out of the war and permit the establishment of a new front against the kaiser's military machine along the Austro-German boundary.

If, as the result of the Piave operations, Austria-Hungary were to surrender unconditionally, Von Hindenburg would have to face an impossible strategic situation brought about by the opening of a new route to Berlin.

By passing through Austria and entering Bohemia, an allied army would reach unhampered the border of Saxony, 140 miles directly southeast of Berlin.

The only way Von Hindenburg there after could defend Berlin would be by withdrawing troops from the Alsace-Lorraine front. If he thus weakened his forces in western Germany, he would open the way to the Rhine. It would be impossible for the kaiser to save both Berlin and the Rhine.

Today's operation along the Piave, therefore, may turn out to be the most important of the war.
