**TWO WARS CONTINUE IN EUROPE TO SETTLE YET**

New York, Nov. 21.—Although the great war itself has ended, two other wars are continuing in Europe and show no present indication of terminating before the opening of the peace conference.

The hang-over conflicts are between Poland and Ukraine in eastern Galicia and between Russia and the allies in the Archangel region. These two are the outcome of difficulties which the peace conference may be totally unable to settle in any fashion approaching permanence.

The conflicting demands of Poland and Ukraine in the eastern area of Galicia, including Lemberg, the capital, have passed beyond the possibility of a settlement by mutual consent. An army from Ukraine has defeated the Polish forces in Galicia, and has established a claim to Lemberg and the famous fortress of Przemyśl by right of conquest. Both races put forth ethnological reasons why the peace conference should decide in their favor, and the delegates at Versailles will leave open wounds whatever may be their verdict.

**Not Formal Condition of War.**

The conflict between Russia and the allies is not a formal condition of belligerency on the part of the entente powers and America, who have never declared war on Russia. Nevertheless, the bolsheviks, the only organized governing authority in Russia, consider an actual state of hostilities exists. Fighting between the allies and the bolsheviks is on a fairly wide scale, and there have been recent indications that the bolshevik troops are well fed and in no sense resemble a rabble army.

There is precedent for a peace conference being held while war continues. During the congress of Vienna at the conclusion of the Napoleonic wars, Napoleon escaped from Elbe.

It will be possible also for the Versailles conference to accept the credentials of any Russian delegates it desires. It will also be possible for the conference to admit delegates both from Poland and Ukraine. But the settlement of Europe's eastern problems cannot be guaranteed by a mere admission of delegates to the peace table.

Eastern Europe is now the world's greatest enigma. All the statesmanship at the world's disposal may be unable to solve the problems involved. The only solvent may be time, and time always means the possibility of other wars.

**OPENING OF CONCLAVE DEPENDS VIRTUALLY ON ENGLISH PREMIER**

Conference Will Be Middle Of December If Lloyd-George Can Leave England.

Washington, Nov. 21.—Convening of the peace conference in France is now virtually up to Lloyd-George.

The British election is December 28. If the premier feels he can leave England before that date, the peace conference should get under way by the middle of December, it is said here. If he cannot leave, however, until after the elections, the conclave probably won't begin until the end of December or the first of January. President Wilson will make his sailing arrangements accordingly. Details of the president's trip are near completion. It is likely Mrs. Wilson will be the only woman on the journey the wives of cabinet delegates going over later.

**Expects to Visit Italy**

The newspaper correspondents will not be taken on the president's vessel, according to the plan now. Only the date of the president's sailing—which originally was planned for December 3, but which now may be delayed some—and the personnel of the peace delegates remain to be announced.

The president expects to visit England and Italy as well as France, his friends say.

It is now generally believed the president will make two trips to Europe during the session, the first for its opening and the second when the peace agreement is ready for final signature.

Determination of the order in which great questions will be handled at the peace table is now the object of discussion preliminary to the conference.

It is proposed to clear up first those questions which will enable all belligerents and neutrals to resume as quickly as possible normal trade conditions. Strong pressure from neutrals urging lifting of the allied blockade is pouring into the present inter-allied exchanges.

**DEFEATS OF AUSTRIA IN 300 YEARS OF WARFARE**

About three hundred years ago, on May 23, 1619, two men were thrown from a window of the Imperial Palace in Prague. This was the first act of violence which brought on the Thirty Years' War.

From that time on, Austria found herself waging a series of wars, in which she was beaten with two exceptions. One was against the Turks and another against the French when her armies were led by Prince Eugene of Savoy.

The record of the fourteen wars, which preceded the present one in which she has suffered the greatest of defeats at the hands of the Italians is as follows:

1618-1648—Thirty Years' War. The Austrians were defeated by Gustavus Adolphus, King of Sweden, at Leipzig in 1631; at Lutzen in 1632; Pommern was conquered. The Austrians were defeated by the French and obliged to sue for peace.

1683—Defeated by the Turks, Emperor Leopold fled from Vienna. He sought the help of King John Sobieski of Poland who saved Vienna from the Turks who had arrived already under the walls of the city.

1707—Prince Eugene of Savoy, commander-in-chief of the Austrian armies, defeated the Turks at Belgrade.

1707-1710—War of the Spanish Succession. Prince Eugene defeated the French in Italy; he joined Marlborough and defeated the French in 1708 at Oudenarde and in 1710 at Malplaque.

1717—Prince Eugene again defeated the Turks at Belgrade.

1757—Seven Years' War. Frederick the Great defeated the Austrians at Prague; the Austrians were defeated at Leuthen, 1757; at Torgau and at Leignitz in 1760 and at Freiburg in 1762.

1796-1797—General Bonaparte defeated the Austrians at Lodi, Areola and Rivoli and drove them out of Italy.

1799—The Austrians were defeated by the French at Hohenlinden and at Zurich.

1800—The Austrians were defeated at Marengo and at Montebello.

1805—The Austrians were defeated by Napoleon at Austerlitz and Vienna was occupied.

1809—Napoleon defeated the Austrians at Eckmuhl, Aspern and Essling; crushed them at Wagram and retook Vienna.

1859—Napoleon III defeated the Austrians at Marengo and Magenta and Solferino and Lombardy was ceded to Italy.

1866—Seven Weeks' War. The Austrians were defeated by the Prussians commanded by Von Moltke, and by Prince Frederick at Sadowa. Austria ceded Venetia to Italy.

**COMPLETE HARMONY IN REPUBLICAN RANKS**

Have Outlined Peace Program To Placate Progressive Element.

Washington, Nov. 21.—Complete harmony in senate republican ranks was forecast today. Will H. Hays, chairman of the republican national committee, was to confer with republican "regulars" and "progressives" on a "get-together" program.

Hays' task will not be difficult, leaders of "old guard" republicans predicted. They have outlined a "peace program" designed to placate "progressives" who have been scolding elimination of Senator Peurson as a fair apparent to the chairmanship of the finance committee and modification of the seniority rule so as to prevent "old guard" leaders from controlling all important legislation through membership on several of the most powerful committees.

This peace program, which leaders hope will end all insurgency, includes the nomination of Senator Poindexter of Washington, a progressive, as president pro tem of the senate and the placing of S. Norris, Cummins, Kenyon and other progressives at the head of the important committees, but keeps Peurson as finance chairman. Under the proposed plan republicans would also support the Norris substitute for the rule of seniority in selecting committee chairmen with some amendments.

**Lewis Urges Government Control Of Public Utilities**

Washington, Nov. 21.—A resolution committing the senate to government ownership of all public utilities and of "natural agencies" for the production of fuel, was introduced today by Senator Lewis, democratic whip.

"It is the expression of the senate," said the resolution, "that the policy of the United States government for the future should be that of governmental ownership of irrevocable railroads, telegraphs, telephones and also national lines of communications necessary to complete postal and telegraphic service to the citizens of the nation.

"The government should possess and own all natural agencies for the production of fuel produced in the land and created as the result of natural agencies. It shall construct and own ships and agencies of water transportation necessary for merchant marine.

**William Hohenzollern Seems To Be Hoarding Food**

Amsterdam, Nov. 21.—William Hohenzollern's hoarding of potatoes, flour and coffee has aroused the residents of Maastricht, who were amazed at the vast stores of articles being transported to Amerongen castle from special trains.

The Dutch did not know how to take the former kaiser's offer to inspect the government aviation school at Soesterberg. Hohenzollern takes frequent rides in Count Von estinck's automobile. He appears to have abandoned his own car, which bore the imperial coat of arms and was inscribed "Gott mit uns."

The telegraph says why favors should be shown the former kaiser. It charges that he is allowed to use special telegraph and telephone lines, from Amerongen castle to Amsterdam.

Count Von Bentinck appears anxious for everybody to understand that he is entertaining Hohenzollern at the request of the Dutch government.

**SALEM GOES OVER TOP IN WAR FUND DRIVE**

Total Subscription From Marion County Reaches Over \$48,000.00

The city of Salem and Marion county proper went over the top for the united war drive last night according to the report of Robert C. Paulus, auditor for the committee. Mr. Paulus reported a total of \$26,117.88 for the city of Salem and \$22,543 for the county outside of Salem and vicinity making a grand total of \$48,660.88, for the county at large. The quota originally assigned to Marion county was \$37,500. The amount raised is approximately 50 per cent in excess of the quota. Just before the opening of the campaign November 11th, all committees were requested by telegram from national headquarters to work for an over-subscription of 50 per cent. Of the over-subscription asked for Marion county has raised 30 and many of the reports from districts in the county are wanting. Auditor Paulus says that he is confident that Marion county will raise somewhere between 140 and 160 per cent of the original quota.

The sum contributed by Marion county, to the united drive is the largest sum yet contributed for war relief purposes. While the official auditor's report has the total at \$48,660, it is conservatively estimated that the total will reach approximately \$55,000.

**Postmaster General Upholds Increase in Phone Rates**

Postmaster General Burleson upholds the increase in telephone rates announced by the Pacific Telephone & Telegraph company as effective November 15, and in a telegram received today by the public service commission he requests that the commission cooperate by accepting the new schedule of rates as though they had been regularly filed with the commission.

The postmaster general points out that the compensation for the company is fixed by a contract made by the government and the increase in rates will add revenue to the government and pay the increased wages of telephone employees.

He does not pass on the question as to the power of the postmaster general to fix rates for telephone service within the state, but his message would indicate that he expects the increased rates to remain in effect in spite of the order issued by the commission declaring the increases to be of "no force and effect."
