WILHELM BELIEVED TO CONFER WITH GERMAN ADHERENTS

French And Holland Newspapers Are Becoming Uneasy Concerning His Presence.

Amsterdam, Nov. 22.—The former kaiser is believed constantly in communication with Germany. It is reported that a wireless station has been erected on top of Count Von Bentinck's estate and that German airplanes frequently fly over the estate, dropping messages.

Tempo Advises Holland Paris, Nov. 22.—Allied action toward inflicting punishment on the kaiser is daily becoming more probable.

The Tempo says: "France particularly has the most cordial sentiments toward Holland, therefore, it, in sincere friendship, advises the quickest possible elimination of the kaiser as an irritating problem. A Hague jurist has rendered an opinion that the Dutch law does not permit extradition. We do not hazard a contrary opinion, but we suggest a much simpler solution, namely expulsion as an undesirable. If put aboard a ship or conducted to the Belgian frontier, the allies will see what disposition is to be made of his case. If conducted to Germany the Berlin government will be in a position to show the measure of its republicanism by its ardor in punishing the author of the war."

Dutch are Uneasy London, Nov. 22.—(British admiralty wireless).—Some of the Dutch newspapers have been dealing of late with the presence of the former kaiser and crown prince in The Netherlands. The Telegraf and some other journals would expel him. Others take a more moderate view, at the same time admitting that it might bring Holland into difficulty.

The Nieuws van Den Dag, a very moderate paper, publishes an article on the subject which shows the uneasiness prevailing in various Dutch circles, about the presence of the Hohenzollerns.

German Propaganda Is Still Active in Mexico

Washington, Nov. 22.—For some unexplained reason, German propagandists are still very active in Mexico, it was learned here today. Their latest efforts are to spread reports of serious disorders in England and France, and stories that humiliating demands are on route to General Carranza from Washington.

PARLIAMENT TO MEET WILSON

Rome, Nov. 22.—At the opening of the parliament today it was decided that practically the entire chamber would go to Paris to greet President Wilson upon his arrival.

ANOTHER O. N. G. COMPANY FOR SALEM

Salem Would Then Become A Battalion Headquarters Military Men Approve.

A move is on foot to organize a second Oregon National Guard company in Salem and at the drill this evening of Company H Oregon Guard, R. W. Simmeral, captain, action will be taken as to who of the company are disposed to join the National Guard.

There is an impression, or rather a conviction that the time has passed when the Oregon Guard will be needed. Yet many men who have become interested in military affairs are anxious to continue their drilling and it is felt that from the four Oregon Guard companies there will be found men enough to organize an Oregon National Guard company should the Oregon guard be disbanded.

Should a second company of Oregon National guard be organized in Salem this will make the city a battalion headquarters. Hence to bring matters to a focus, at the drills next week of the four companies of the Oregon guard, the proposition will be put squarely before the men as to how many will enlist with the Oregon National Guard.

Among men who have become interested in military affairs, it is felt that Salem should have two Oregon National guard companies, especially as there is a general feeling that the emergency that called for the Oregon guard has passed.

In an Oregon National guard, a company must include 100 men and three officers. Military men of the city say the army will easily care for the work of two companies. When the general staff was in the city a few days ago it was shown through the armory and attention was called to the need of putting it in proper condition for military purposes.

SUBMARINES GIVEN UP

Stockholm, Nov. 22.—According to an agreement entered between Germany and Great Britain, five German submarines interned in Swedish waters will leave soon for England, it was announced today.

NO MORE EXTRA HOURS

Washington, Nov. 22.—Extra hours of labor in the mechanical shops of rail way lines were abolished in orders issued late today by Director General McAdoo. On November 25 a nine-hour day will prevail where a greater number is now being worked. On and after December 9, the basic eight hour day will follow.

CUPPER RECEIVES HIS APPOINTMENT TODAY

New State Engineer Recognizes Need Of Comprehensive Construction Plan.

Percy A. Cupper today received from Governor Withycombe his certificate of appointment as state engineer to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of State Engineer Lewis.

"It seems probable that we are on the eve of a great development of our national resources throughout the entire nation," said Cupper, when commenting on the work he is now taking up. "Undoubtedly the federal government will adopt a comprehensive program, including the construction of irrigation, drainage and power projects and the reclamation of logged off lands.

"One of the problems of the state of Oregon in this connection is to foresee what form the national development program will take and then adjust conditions in this state, through legislation and otherwise to place it in a position to receive the benefits from this national program of development. Not that all development will be done by the national government, but the government's program will influence to a very large extent development by other agencies. Oregon is particularly fortunate in having had a thorough investigation made of many of her important irrigation projects in cooperation with the federal government which investigation now forms an excellent basis for further cooperation and also in that Oregon has what is probably the best irrigation district law in the United States. The good effect of this statute has been shown in the past 18 months in the sale of more than \$2,000,000 for Oregon irrigation district bonds, while for several years previous no irrigation securities at all were disposed of.

"It will be the policy of this office to cultivate the present tendency towards a closer relation with the water users of the state to the end that the public interest as well as the interest of the individual water user may be best served.

"The time seems particularly opportune to combine the duties of the superintendent of water division No. 1 with those of the state engineer as the water rights on many of the important streams in this division have been adjusted and the work can doubtless now be handled more economically by one official, thus saving to the state the salary of the superintendent of water division No. 1 at this time when economy in all lines is so essential.

Washington, Nov. 22.—The emperor of Japan has conferred the grand cordon of the order of the Rising Sun upon Chief of Staff March and upon General Tasker H. Bliss and the grand cordon of the order of Paouwnia on General Pershing.

Washington, Nov. 22.—President and Mrs. Wilson today talked by radio telephone to a squadron of airplanes flying far overhead some two miles from the White House. The president expressed amazement at the wonderful invention.
