Much Dissatisfaction
Manifestly there is more dissatisfaction over his course than there has been over almost anything he has done since he took office.

Justifiably, the presidential suggestion for food aid to the central committee is now crystallizing. For instance, Secretary of Agriculture Houston received today an appeal to the American farmers for a record breaking crop production.

It seems clear that contributions must be made, in no inconsiderable measure, to the peoples of Austria and to some extent to Germany, Houston said.

Houston Favors Food Aid
Even our former enemies must be considered if for no higher purpose than that of enlightened selfishness. The world cannot afford to have a prevalence of chaos and riot in any part of it, if it can be prevented. Hungry people are dangerous and reasonable sustenance is a prerequisite to the return of normal conditions and the securing of domestic institutions.

Referring to general conditions in Europe, Houston said: "Undoubtedly the demand from Europe for available foodstuffs until the next harvest season will be great. England's food production has increased during the war, but England still is and will continue to be an importer of foodstuffs. France will undoubtedly need unusually large supplies.

Belgium, Poland, Holland, Norway, Switzerland and other countries whose production has been greatly disturbed, or which normally import foodstuffs will call upon us."

A new phase of the peace conference situation arose today with revelations that Turkey is anxious for American aid in finance and police work. The matter probably will come up for peace table discussion.

Hugo Preuss has been appointed German state secretary of the interior.

decided in favor of quitting and the canvass of the vote has been officially turned in to U. G. Boyer, county clerk.

Within 30 days after the city is authorized to surrender its charter, it must also surrender to the county of Marion any property it may have on hand, and a demand has been made on the city clerk, George E. Penrod, to return to Marion county any of the city's possessions. This will include a gravel bank that the county may find convenient in construction of roads. Also some personal property.

When Butteville surrenders its charter it will have on its hands the care of its electric lights, sidewalks and some other improvements but these can easily be taken care of by popular subscriptions.

Butteville history goes back as far as that of Champeog. It was settled by F. X. Matthew in 1842 and in 1844 a store was built and the town became one of the main trading centers, having river transportation. The founder, F. X. Matthew was one of the men who met at Champeog in 1842 and was instrumental in bringing this part of Oregon under the administration of the United States.

In the great flood of the Willamette valley in 1861, the store buildings at Butteville were swept away, but the town soon regained its trading interests having wharves suitable for the handling of merchandise and the wheat of French Prairie.

When its charter is surrendered Jan. 6, 1919, and its property turned over to Marion county, the final chapter in the story of the city of Butteville, at one time the leading city of the valley, will have been written.

Court House Notes

In the matter of the mortgage foreclosure proceedings of the case of W. O. Christensen against Carrie Riggs, et al, the court decreed that the plaintiff have judgment for the several sums of \$900, \$72, and \$90, with \$25 for attorney's fees and that the mortgage be foreclosed with the plaintiff to have prior rights.
