### ALL 40-50 PRUNES ARE NOW RELEASED

#### Telegram To Prune Packers Disclosed Welcome News This Morning.

Packers this morning received a telegram from the federal food administration releasing all 40-50 prunes. This was about the most encouraging news received in the city for the past three months or since the government commandeered the entire crop.

The effect of this release will permit packers here to fill their contracts entered into early this fall with eastern wholesale houses. In fact, the larger Fruit Co. already is packing and shipping the released prunes to their customers with which contracts have been made, but which were held up by the government.

While the 40-50's are released, the government still holds the other sizes but as this size is the one the markets have been demanding, and as there is a strong civilian demand, packers for the first time in three months are feeling greatly encouraged.

The telegram permits packers to sell at the maximum price as fixed by the federal food administration.

### ANOTHER CANNING IN U'TRY FOR SALEM

Salem is to have another canning industry that will within a few years represent an investment of approximately \$50,000.

F. A. Kurtz has leased from the Oregon Electric about three-fourths of the block on North Front street bounded by Front, Commercial and 1st streets for the building of a cannery to be erected this winter and spring.

Already about 30,000 feet of lumber has been purchased for the erection of the buildings and a surveyor has made a preliminary survey of the grounds. The cannery will at first be devoted to gullion goods. The buildings will face on Front street.

### LABOR LEADERS KEEP UP STRIKE AGITATION

#### Labor Councils Pledge Support To Obtain New Trial For Mooney.

New York, Nov. 30.—New York labor leaders declared today that the agitation for a nation wide strike to be held December 9 as a demonstration against the failure of the California governor to pardon Thomas J. Mooney would begin at once.

W. D. Patterson, representative of the International Workers' Defense League, issued a statement calling upon the workers to rally to Mooney's

defense and demand his liberation. He outlined plans for a nation wide campaign of agitation.

Three hundred thousand organized workers of the Central Federated Union of Greater New York have pledged their support to Mooney and have forwarded resolutions to President Wilson asking that he be granted a new trial.

They also threaten to join in the nation wide strike movement. Arrangements are now being made for a Mooney demonstration here December 7. If proper police protection is assured, labor leaders say the parade will be held.

#### Temporary Indecision

San Francisco, Nov. 30.—With sentiment crystallizing following the commutation of Thomas J. Mooney's death sentence to life imprisonment by Governor Stephens, it became apparent today that a large portion of labor intended to go through with its strike plans early in December.

The strikes were first planned as a protest over what was termed "the proposed murder" of Mooney. The governor's action, which was unexpected in some quarters, caused a flurry and temporary indecision.

The San Francisco labor council condemned Governor Stephens' action and pledged moral and financial support to obtain a new trial for Mooney.

The Oakland Shipwrights' Brotherhood voted last night to strike December 8 unless Mooney is given a new trial.

Reports from other cities indicated strike plans had not been dropped.

in France, March declared that the 27th and 30th divisions had not been designated for convoys home yet. They will be assigned back to General Pershing from their positions on the British front, and take their turn from him.

Army transports, navy boats and cargo carriers, reconverted into passenger ships, will be used to bring the men back from France. When these vessels are entirely equipped, the 300,000 rate should be maintained.

As for demobilization in the states, March pointed out, the work is being speeded up and the war department is doing its utmost to attain the 1000 a day rate at each camp so as to get men back to industry quickly. Officers and men discharged to date in the states number about 45,378.

March announced awards of distinguished service medals to Generals Bliss, Dickman, Bullard, Harbord and McAndrew. He also announced the appointment of Colonels Churchill, Ayres and Martin and Majors Helms, Rurong, Auchincloss, Flynn and Charles to the military section of the peace conference.

### JENNIE HALL WINS SUIT AGAINST TURNER

#### City Of Turner Still Has Chance To Keep Concrete Wall Across Springs.

In her suit against the City of Turner for taking all the water from the Green Springs adjoining her farm, Jennie J. Hall won, in an opinion handed down yesterday by Judge George G. Bingham. But there are several strings to the decision that still gives Turner a chance to maintain its concrete wall across the springs and to secure its water from the flow of Green Springs.

The unusual part of the decision is that the enforcement of the decree against the City of Turner is stayed for 60 days in order that it may have the opportunity of purchase by which it may acquire the flowage of all the water from the springs. Or if this cannot be arranged, the city is given time to commence proceedings of condemnation of the property and rights of Mrs. Hall. If condemnation proceedings are commenced within 60 days, then the decree is further stayed until the final determination of the proceedings, provided they are prosecuted with due diligence.
