It might be well for those who have automobiles in the city to lock them securely this evening, as five of the 13 boys who escaped last night from the reform school are still at large and every one of them knows how to drive.

In the first get away, one of the boys lost his companions and came back to the school. After escaping, most of the boys, all dressed in the regulation khaki uniforms, headed direct for Salem. Five succeeded in finding an auto and were driving towards Portland when stopped by Sheriff W. I. Needham. It is thought the five who have not been captured are somewhere in the vicinity of Salem waiting an opportunity to help themselves to cars with which to make their get-away. The leader of the boys is named Calhoun who was picked up in Salem a few months ago by Sheriff Needham. The boy had stolen a Dodge car in Portland and was on his way south at the time of his arrest.

In order that tax payers may express an opinion as to the school budget to be voted on today, the polls will be kept open until 7 o'clock this evening. The voting place is an State street adjoining the Postal Telegraph office. It is understood that a meeting was held last evening by a certain element that is in favor of defeating the proposed budget, regardless of what effect it would have in disorganizing the present school standard. Only those whose names are on the tax roll or who have acquired property to be assessed since the last assessment, may vote in districts the size of Salem. There is a property qualification in districts of the first and second class. A second class district is one that has a population of more than 300. Where there is a smaller population, any qualified voter may cast a vote at the annual budget election.
