## PROGRAM FOR ROAD BUILDING IN REPORT BY COMMISSIONERS

### Salem-Aurora Paving Project Is Post Road And Not Included In Total.

At its meeting in Portland yesterday, the state highway commission announced a road building program for next year which calls for expenditure of state funds in the amount of \$3,525,200. This does not include the post road and forest road projects, in connection with which the government will pay half the cost.

The Salem-Aurora paving project is a post road project and is not included in the total announced, but the highway commission has stated this road will be paved early next spring.

The program announced by the commission is not complete, as the commission has yet to determine the work which will be done in Polk, Douglas and a few other counties. Bids on the Hood River-Mosier project will be received at the commission's next meeting, which will be held January 7.

Following is a statement of the commission's program, as thus far outlined, for the expenditure of funds from the \$6,000,000 bond fund and the quarter mill road tax and automobile license fund:
