No language but the English will be taught in the public schools of Oregon should the bill presented in the house yesterlay by Dodd o fHermiston fina-

The bill reads: "It shall be un-lawful for any board of directors or regents or trustees or for any teacher or other person teaching in the public schools in the state of Oregon to cause to be taught or to teach any subject or subjects other than foreign languages in the public or private schools in the state of Oregon in any language ex-cept the English."

Should the bill pass both the house and senate and be signed by the gov-ernor, any person teaching a foreign language would be subject to a penalty of a fine not less than \$100 and not more than \$500 or in lieu there of, 30 days in jail.

The physical condition of the peniten-tinery will be investigated. Sam A Hughes, representative from Marion county yesterday arose in the house and moved that a committee of seven be appointed to investigate the physical conditions of the buildings only. He made it plain that the buildings were to be investigated and not the manage ment or inmates. It was also suggest-ed that the chairman of the ways and means committee of the house should meet with the committee. The motion was carried unanimously. There seems to be a general opinion that the build-ings of the state penitentiary and the general sanitary conditions are about 25 years behind the ties, although the voters of the state not so long ago turned down the proposal to appropriate money for rebuilding the pen.


