Bakersfield Had Highest Record In Loan Contest

San Francisco, Feb. 3.—The ten Pacific slope cities which won the right to name ten United States ships were named today by the federal reserve bank. They are: Los Angeles, Seattle, Spokane, Berkeley, Pasadena, Bakersfield, Eureka, Aberdeen, Reno and Alameda.

The honor cities win because their percentage of over-subscription in the fourth liberty loan outranked all others. The principal cities were divided into five classes, according to population.

Bakersfield's record of 254 per cent over-subscription is the highest in the entire Twelfth district. Los Angeles had the largest number of subscribers—246,001.

Plans will immediately be made in these ten cities to select their names, choose sponsors and provide fitting programs.

Although San Francisco did not win a place, its total subscription of \$110,836,150 was two and one-third times as large as the nearest competitor, Los Angeles.

Rules of the contest were that one city should be chosen from each of class A, B, and C, two from class D and five from Class E.
