Citizen Privileged To Debate Bill In Senate

L. H. McMahan has the distinction of being the only citizen to be extended the courtesy of the floor of the senate and permitted to enter in the debate for or against any bill at this session of the legislature.

He was present when the senate had under consideration senate bill 153, which was introduced for him by Senator Patterson, and when various senators were jumping all over the bill, Senator Lachmund asked that Mr. McMahan be permitted to explain the purposes of the bill.

After Mr. McMahan explained the bill the senate buried it under an avalanche of negative votes. The bill made it a crime for any manufacturer or dealer to sell machinery in this state without first filing with the secretary of state a sworn statement showing the cost of the various parts of the machine. Mr. McMahan explained that the purpose was to prevent the manufacturers and dealers from gouging the farmers by charging excessive prices for machine parts. He said a binder for which he paid \$4000 would cost \$22,000 if purchased a part at a time and then assembled.

About \$200,000,000 more soon will be appropriated. The government has approved 700 road projects, totaling 7,869 miles, and it is this work that the department is anxious to start at once.

Only eight states have completed roads under the government plan, although it has been in force since 1917. Arkansas has built five miles; California seven; Louisiana four; Massachusetts 14; North Carolina eight; Vermont one; Washington, four and West Virginia two.
