Seattle, Wash., March 3.—Seattle, Tacoma and Aberdeen shipyard workers approximating close to 40,000 men will poll a back-to-work vote commencing Thursday on terms to be arranged at a joint Metal Trades Council meeting in Seattle tomorrow. This line of action was decided upon at a meeting of Tacoma, Seattle and

Aberdeen strike officials held in Tacoma yesterday afternoon, with the reservation that Pacific coast shipyard workers be assured first of proper representation at the shipyard wage conference to be held in Washington, D. C., March 17th.
