For a continuous off and on rainfall, the record is now being broken, as there has been a precipitation every day for the past 30 days. The total rainfall for the 30 days has been 2.88 inches and yet the weather authorities tell us that we are a little short for the winter rainfall. And with the abundance of rain, the peaceful Willamette has been breaking some records for continuous high water. Beginning with 1.5 feet above the low water mark on Jan. 1, it rose to 29.5 feet on Jan. 24. Then dropped to 4 feet above on Feb. 4. But with the early February rains, the water rose to 14.8 feet Feb 11 and dropped to 6 feet above on the 23d. But the continuous rains again brought an enormous volume of water past Salem until yesterday the gauge read 15.3 feet above. Today the water is gradually falling.
