The Income Tax drive comes to lose on Saturday night, March 15, The payments and returns due or

that date under the provisions of the new Revenue Law must be in the hands of local Internal Revenue Collectors efore their offices close that night.

The laggards and the dodgers will face severe fines and jail sentences, The Internal Revenue Bureau announces that its officers will check us all up to see that every person who omes within the scope of the Income Tax law did his share.

Where to Pay and File.

Residents of Oregon are required to make their returns and pay their taxes to Milton A. Miller, Collector of Internal Revenue, Portland, Ore., or to any of his deputy collectors who are now doing free advisory work on Incom-

Payments sent by mail should be attached to the returns and should be in the form of check, money order or draft. Cash payments by mail are sent at the taxpayer's risk of loss.
