## COURT HOUSE.

In the county court, April 21 has been set as the date for the final hearing in matter of the estate of Henry L. Place. N. A. Hafford is administrator. The estate amounted to \$1989.53 and the administrator has \$678.10 to distribute between the two heirs. F. L. Place and Everett Place.

The appraisal of the estate of Eva Coolidge has been filed in the office of the county clerk. It shows that the estate has stock in the Coolidge & McClaine bank amounting to \$11,990; that it had \$48,198.06 in the bank and had an investment of \$7,708 in Liberty bonds. The total value of the estate is appraised at \$58,166.16.

The estate of Lai Yee Sun has been appraised at 176.87, Mark Skiff, W. J. Culver, and J. H. Dunlap were the appraisers.

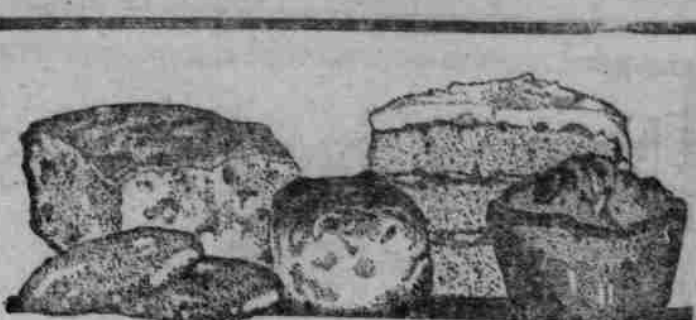
W. M. Bushey, county judge, has filed in the office of the county clerk, no fee of inheritance tax claimed from the estate of J. M. Morley, who died Sept. 19, 1918, in Silverton. The estate was appraised at \$10,900.76. The expenses of the administration of the estate were as follows: Court costs, \$20; administrator's fees, \$518; attorney fees, \$250; last illness, \$149.50 and funeral charges, \$279.50, making a total of administration fees of \$1217. The widow, Bertha E. Morley will receive by the will \$9,817.56. The law allows \$5000 exempt on inheritance tax and she will be obliged to pay only \$48.17. The son, about three years old, will receive by the will the balance, \$8,816.08 and his share of inheritance tax is estimated at \$38.17.
