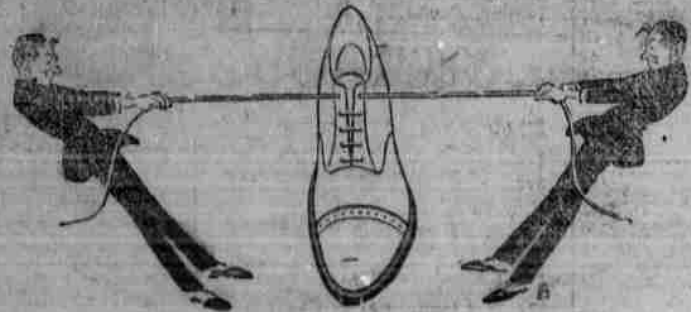

### Complete Record Of Work Done In War To Be Compiled

For the information of future generations, a complete record will be made of the activities of every community in the state as to what its citizens did during the great European war. This record will not only include a memorandum of services in the army and navy, but of activities in every work that helped to win the war. And this includes the names of those who took an active part in Liberty loan drives and the efforts made at home.

For the county of Marion, W. M. Smith has appointed local historians to be by Cordelia Marvin, state librarian. In order that each community may have its complete record on file, Mr. Smith has appointed local historians and their efforts will be in addition to the co-operation of teachers in every school district.

### Employment Bureau In Salem Doing Business

The U. S. employment bureau is still on the job in Salem notwithstanding the fact that the appropriation bill failed to pass the last congress. It is felt that when congress convenes again that the bill will be passed and the appropriation made to keep up all employment bureaus.

In Salem the office is now located on South Liberty street just south of the Salem Bank of Commerce, in the office rooms formerly occupied by the republican county headquarters, James R. Coleman and Mrs. Grace Holt are

still in charge of the office. Frank E. Manning, a Portland attorney, was in the city looking over the work of the bureau and assured Judge Lawrence T. Harris of the community labor board that the office would be maintained. The blackboard of the U. S. employment bureau office on which is listed the calls for labor, shows that just at present farm hands are in demand, at wages running from \$15 to \$20 a month and board. Men are wanted who know how to plow. There is also a lively demand for loganberry trainers. Also wood cutters who are offered \$2.50 a day.

### ABANDON "BIG TEN" MEETINGS

Paris, March 25.—American advocates of a speeding up process for the peace conference have obtained a decision to abandon the "big ten" conference it was learned today.

All peace questions hereafter will be handled by President Wilson, Premier Lloyd George, Premier Clemenceau and Premier Orlando, with the Japanese and others called in when directly affected.

The quartet of allied leaders now known as the "big four" will meet twice a day, giving the effect of practically continuous session.

The "big ten" or supreme war council, comprises the premiers and foreign ministers of Great Britain, France, Italy and Japan and President Wilson and Secretary Lansing.
